SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Makes appropriations and reappropriations for capital programs for various agencies for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2007.

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1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:
