### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

70 ILCS 3605/30

from Ch. 111 2/3, par. 330

Amends the Metropolitan Transit Authority Act. Provides that, within 3 months after the effective date of the amendatory Act, the Board of the Chicago Transit Authority must increase fares for all fixed route transportation services provided by the Authority in an amount sufficient to offset the cost of providing transit services without charge to senior citizen residents of the metropolitan region in accordance with Public Act 95-0708. Effective immediately.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Metropolitan Transit Authority Act is 5 amended by changing Section 30 as follows:

6 (70 ILCS 3605/30) (from Ch. 111 2/3, par. 330)

7 Sec. 30. The Board shall make all rules and regulations 8 governing the operation of the transportation system, shall 9 determine all routings and change the same whenever it is deemed advisable by the Board, subject to the provisions of any 10 ordinance granting rights to the Authority. Except as provided 11 "Regional 12 Section 4.11(b)(5) of the Transportation in 13 Authority Act", the Board shall fix rates, fares and charges 14 for transportation, provided that they shall be at all times sufficient in the aggregate to provide revenues (a) for the 15 16 payment of the interest on and principal of all bonds, 17 certificates and other obligations payable from said revenues and to meet all other charges upon such revenues as provided by 18 19 any trust agreement executed by the Authority in connection 20 with the issuance of bonds or certificates under this Act, (b) 21 for the payment of all operating costs including all charges 22 which may be incurred pursuant to Sections 29 and 39 of this Act and all other costs and charges incidental to the operation 23

of the transportation system, (c) for the payment of all costs 1 2 and charges incurred pursuant to Sections 37 and 38 of this Act 3 and any other costs and charges for acquisition, installation, construction or for replacement or reconstruction 4 of equipment, structures or rights of way not financed through 5 issuance of bonds or certificates under Section 12 of this Act, 6 7 and (d) for any compensation required to be paid to any 8 municipality for the use of streets, subways and other public 9 ways. The Board may provide free transportation within any 10 municipality in and by which they are employed for firemen and 11 public health nurses, when in uniform, and policemen when in 12 uniform or, when not in uniform, upon presentation of 13 identification policemen, shall as and provide free 14 transportation to sworn law enforcement personnel of the Cook 15 County Sheriff's Department when in uniform or, when not in 16 uniform, upon presentation of identification as sworn law 17 enforcement personnel of the Cook County Sheriff's Department, and may provide free transportation for employees of 18 the 19 Authoritv when in uniform upon presentation of or 20 identification as such employees, and may enter into agreements United States Post Office Department for 21 with the the 22 transportation of mail, and the payment of compensation to the 23 Authority in lieu of fares for the transportation of letter carriers, when in uniform at all times. 24

The Board may also provide free transportation, or transportation at reduced fares, to all or designated classes

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of pupils in attendance at public schools of school districts 1 2 within or partly within the territorial limits of the Authority, or in attendance at private schools offering grades 3 of instruction comparable to those offered in public schools, 4 5 under such conditions as shall be prescribed by the Board, and, 6 if otherwise authorized by law, the Board may contract with 7 public school boards and representatives of private schools, for reimbursement of pupil transportation costs from public 8 9 funds.

Within 3 months after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 95th General Assembly, the Board must increase fares for all fixed route transportation services provided by the Authority in an amount sufficient to offset the cost of providing transit services without charge to senior citizen residents of the metropolitan region in accordance with Public Act 95-0708.
