SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

For Fiscal Year 2008, appropriates \$23,472,892 (instead of \$20,700,000) from the Education Assistance Fund to the State Board of Education for General State Aid - Hold Harmless. For Fiscal Year 2008, appropriates \$3,618,167,108 (instead of \$3,620,940,000) from the Common School Fund to the State Board of Education for General State Aid. Effective immediately.

A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. "AN ACT making appropriations", Public Act 95-
5 348, approved August 23, 2007, is amended by changing Section
6 10 of Article 5 as follows:

7 (P.A. 95-348, Article 5, Section 10)

8 Sec. 10. The following amounts or so much thereof as may
9 be necessary, which shall be used by the Illinois State Board
10 of Education exclusively for the foregoing purposes and not,
11 under any circumstances, for personal services expenditures
12 or other operational or administrative costs, are
13 appropriated to the Illinois State Board of Education for the
14 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2007:
