A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

10 Section 35. The sum of \$14,392,600, or so much thereof
11 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Mandatory
12 Arbitration Fund to the Supreme Court for Mandatory
13 Arbitration Programs.

14 Section 40. The sum of \$131,500, or so much thereof as
15 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Foreign Language
16 Interpreter Fund to the Supreme Court for the Foreign
17 Language Interpreter Program.

18 Section 45. The sum of \$818,900, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Lawyers'
20 Assistance Program Fund to the Supreme Court for lawyers'
21 assistance programs.

1 Section 50. The sum of \$795,400, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Reviewing Court
3 Alternative Dispute Resolution Fund to the Supreme Court for
4 alternative dispute resolution programs within the reviewing
5 courts.

6 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1,
7 2008.
