1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 6339

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend House Bill 6339 by everything
3 after the enacting clause with the following:

4 "ARTICLE 5

5 OFFICE OF THE ARCHITECT OF THE CAPITOL

6 Section 5. The amount of \$3,883, or so much of this
7 amount as may be necessary and remains unexpended on June 30,
8 2008, from a reappropriation heretofore made for such purpose
9 in Section 5 of Article 455 of Public Act 95-348, is
10 reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the
11 Office of the Architect of the Capitol for plans,
12 specifications, and continuation of work pursuant to the
13 report and recommendations of the architectural, structural,
14 and mechanical surveys of the State Capitol Building. This is

1 for the continuation of the rehabilitation of the Capitol
2 Building.

3 Section 10. The sum of \$553,641, or so much thereof as
4 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
5 business on June 30, 2008, from a reappropriation heretofore
6 made for such purposes in Section 10 of Article 455 of Public
7 Act 95-348, is reappropriated from the Capital Development
8 Fund to the Office of the Architect of the Capitol for
9 remodeling, planning, relocation, permanent equipment, and
10 other related expenses, including architectural and
11 engineering fees associated with construction, for the
12 remodeling of office space and other support areas under the
13 jurisdiction of the House of Representatives and the Senate.

14 Section 15. No contract shall be entered into or
15 obligation incurred for any expenditures from appropriations
16 in Section 5 and 10 of this Article until after the purposes
17 and amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

20 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

1 Section 5. The following named amounts, or so much
 2 thereof as may be necessary are appropriated to the
 3 Department of Agriculture for repairs, maintenance, and
 4 capital improvements including construction, reconstruction,
 5 improvement, repair and installation of capital facilities,
 6 cost of planning, supplies, materials, equipment, services
 7 and all other expenses required to complete the work:

8 Payable from Agricultural Premium Fund:

9 For various projects at the State

10 Fairgrounds 600,000

11 For various projects at the DuQuoin State

12 Fairgrounds 250,000

13 Total \$850,000

14 Section 15. The amount of \$2,612,500, or so much thereof
 15 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Partners for
 16 Conservation Projects Fund to the Department of Agriculture
 17 for the Conservation Practices Cost-Share program.

18 Section 20. The amount of \$2,612,500, or so much thereof
 19 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works
 20 Fund to the Department of Agriculture for deposit into the
 21 Partners for Conservation Projects Fund.

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ARTICLE 15

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DEPARTMENT OF CENTRAL MANAGEMENT SERVICES

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Section 5. The amount of \$13,500,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works Fund to the Department of Central Management Services for infrastructure improvement, hardware and related costs.

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Section 10. No contract shall be entered into or obligation incurred for any expenditures from appropriations in Section 5 of this Article until after the purposes and amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

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ARTICLE 20

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DEPARTMENT OF CENTRAL MANAGEMENT SERVICES

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Section 5. The sum of \$8,748,300, or so much thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation heretofore made for such purpose in Article 465, Section 5 of Public Act 95-348, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the Department of Central Management Services for

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1 Information Technology infrastructure expenses including but
2 not limited to related hardware and equipment.

3 Section 10. No contract shall be entered into or
4 obligation incurred for any expenditures from appropriations
5 in Section 5 of this Article until after the purposes and
6 amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

8 ARTICLE 25

9 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

10 Section 5. The sum of \$3,000,000, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Port Development
12 Revolving Loan Fund to the Department of Commerce and
13 Economic Opportunity for grants and loans associated with the
14 Port Development Revolving Loan Program pursuant to 30 ILCS
15 750/9-11.

16 Section 10. The sum of \$50,000,000, or so much thereof
17 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works
18 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
19 for all costs associated with the capital development of coal
20 gasification plants.

1 Section 15. The sum of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works
3 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
4 for a grant to the Abraham Lincoln Capital Airport to realign
5 the front entrance road.

6 Section 20. The sum of \$450,000,000, or so much thereof
7 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works
8 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
9 for grants, loans, and investments or other economic
10 development activities including, but not limited to,
11 community public safety programs, job creation and retention
12 programs, community support and economic development.

13 Section 21. The sum of \$150,000,000, or so much thereof
14 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works
15 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
16 for grants, loans and investments or other activities
17 associated with health care development, including but not
18 limited to the Hospital Capital Investment Program.

19 Section 22. The sum of \$50,000,000, or so much thereof
20 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works
21 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity

1 for affordable housing grants, loans, and investments.

2 Section 25. The sum of \$25,000,000, or so much thereof
3 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works
4 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
5 for all costs associated with investment in next generation
6 ethanol production using cellulosic, fractionation and other
7 next generation technologies.

8 Section 30. The sum of \$17,000,000, or so much thereof
9 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works
10 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
11 for a grant to Fermi National Accelerator Laboratory for the
12 Illinois Accelerator Research Center.

13 Section 35. The sum of \$13,000,000, or so much thereof
14 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works
15 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
16 for a grant to Argonne National Laboratory for the Advanced
17 Protein Crystallization Facility.

18 Section 40. The sum of \$60,000,000, or so much thereof
19 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works
20 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
21 for a grant to University of Illinois at Urbana/Champaign for

1 all costs associated with design and construction of a
2 Petascale Computing Facility.

3 Section 45. The sum of \$490,000, or so much thereof as
4 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works
5 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
6 for a grant to University of Illinois at Chicago for all
7 costs associated with planning campus improvements.

8 Section 50. The sum of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof as
9 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works
10 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
11 for grants associated with adding new E-85 fuel pumps across
12 the State.

13 Section 55. The sum of \$20,000,000, or so much thereof
14 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works
15 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
16 for all costs associated with investment in next generation
17 biodiesel production.

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19 Section 56. The sum of \$53,000,000, or so much thereof
20 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works
21 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
22 for a grant to Southern Illinois University for the research

1 and development of new coal-based energy systems including,
2 but not limited to, feasibility and design for carbon
3 management in commercial settings, planning, design, and
4 construction of an energy and science laboratory, and
5 engineering and design initiatives for the development and
6 upgrading of existing electric generating systems.

7 Section 60. The sum of \$200,000,000, or so much thereof
8 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works
9 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
10 for the making of grants and expenditures for planning,
11 engineering, acquisition, construction, reconstruction,
12 development, improvement and extension of public
13 infrastructure in the State of Illinois, including grants to
14 local governments for public infrastructure, grants to public
15 elementary and secondary school districts for public
16 infrastructure, grants to universities, colleges, community
17 colleges, and non-profit corporations for public purposes,
18 including but not limited to expenditures for equipment,
19 vehicles, community programs, and recreational facilities.

20 Section 65. The sum of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof as
21 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works
22 Fund to the Department Of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
23 for a grant to the University of Illinois at Urbana/Champaign

1 for the Information Trust Institute to procure and develop
2 the Center for Pervasive Health Technology.

3 Section 75. The amount of \$25,000,000, or so much
4 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the
5 Illinois Works Fund to the Department of Commerce and
6 Economic Opportunity for grants to local governments for
7 capital improvements to civic centers for the projects
8 hereinafter enumerated:

 16 appropriation herein made in Sections 5, 10, 15, 20, 21, 22,

 18 Article until after the purpose and amounts have been
 19 approved in writing by the Governor.

22 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

1 Section 5. The sum of \$319,116, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
3 business on June 30, 2008, from a reappropriation heretofore
4 made in Article 475, Section 30 of Public Act 95-348, is
5 reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the
6 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for Coal
7 Development Programs.

8 Section 10. The sum of \$50,000,000, or so much thereof
9 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
10 business on June 30, 2008, from a reappropriation heretofore
11 made in Article 475, Section 35 of Public Act 95-348, is
12 reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the
13 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
14 pursuant to 20 ILCS 605/605-332 - Coal Revival Program.

15 Section 15. The sum of \$1,975,000, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
17 business on June 30, 2008, from a reappropriation heretofore
18 made in Article 475, Section 70 of Public Act 95-348, is
19 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
20 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
21 associated with the Illinois Renewable Fuels Development Act.

1 Section 20. The sum of \$13,000,000, or so much thereof
2 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
3 business on June 30, 2008, from a reappropriation heretofore
4 made in Article 475, Section 75 of Public Act 95-348, is
5 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
6 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant
7 to the Argonne National Laboratory for the Rare Isotope
8 Accelerator for bondable infrastructure improvements. This
9 appropriated amount shall be in addition to any other
10 appropriated amounts which can be expended for these
11 purposes.

12 Section 25. The amount of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof
13 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
14 business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation heretofore
15 made in Article 475, Section 120 of Public Act 95-348, is
16 reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the
17 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the
18 specific purposes of acquisition, development, construction,
19 reconstruction, improvement, financing, architectural and
20 technical planning and installation of capital facilities
21 consisting of buildings, structures, durable equipment, and
22 land for the purpose of capital development of coal resources
23 within the State.

1 Section 30. The amount of \$17,000,000, or so much
2 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
3 close of business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation
4 heretofore made in Article 475, Section 125 of Public Act 95-
5 348, is reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the
6 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the
7 specific purposes of acquisition, development, construction,
8 reconstruction, improvement, financing, architectural and
9 technical planning and installation of capital facilities
10 consisting of buildings, structures, durable equipment, and
11 land for the purpose of capital development of coal resources
12 within the State, including but not limited to a grant for a
13 commercial scale project that produces electric power and
14 hydrogen and demonstrates underground storage of up to 1

4 for such purposes.

6 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
7 business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation heretofore

9 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
10 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant
11 to Argonne National Laboratory for the Advanced Protein
12 Crystallization Facility.

14 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the

19 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
20 grants associated with the Illinois Renewable Fuels

8 amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
9 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
10 grants and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8,

12 Section 30. The sum of \$209,915,700, or so much thereof
13 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
14 business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation heretofore
15 made for such purpose in Article 475, Section 90 of Public
16 Act 95-348, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
17 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
18 Opportunity for the purpose of making grants and loans to
19 local governments for planning, engineering, acquisition,
20 construction, reconstruction, development, improvement and
21 extension of the public infrastructure, and for any other
22 purposes authorized in subsection (a) of Section 4 of the
23 Build Illinois Bond Act and for grants to State agencies for

1 such purposes.

2 Section 35. The sum of \$47,500,000, or so much thereof
3 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
4 business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation heretofore
5 made for such purpose in Article 475, Section 95 of Public
6 Act 95-348, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
7 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
8 Opportunity for the purpose of fostering economic development
9 and increased employment and the well being of the citizens
10 of Illinois, and for any other purposes authorized in
11 subsection (b) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act
12 and for grants to State agencies for such purposes.

13 Section 40. The sum of \$30,646,616, or so much thereof
14 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
15 business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation heretofore
16 made for such purpose in Article 475, Section 100 of Public
17 Act 95-348, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
18 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
19 Opportunity for the development and improvement of
20 educational, scientific, technical and vocational programs
21 and facilities and the expansion of health and human
22 services, and for any other purposes authorized in subsection
23 (c) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act and for

1 grants to State agencies for such purposes.

2 Section 45. The sum of \$30,000,000, or so much thereof
3 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
4 business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation heretofore
5 made for such purpose in Article 475, Section 105 of Public
6 Act 95-348, as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital
7 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
8 Opportunity for open spaces, recreational and conservation
9 purposes and the protection of land and for deposits into the
10 Conservation 2000 Projects Fund as authorized by subsection
11 (c) of Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act or for
12 grants to State agencies for such purposes.

13 Section 50. The sum of \$36,789,996, or so much thereof
14 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
15 business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation heretofore
16 made for such purpose in Article 475, Section 110 of Public
17 Act 95-348, as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital
18 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
19 Opportunity for grants to local governments for the
20 acquisition, financing, architectural planning, development,
21 alteration, installation, and construction of capital
22 facilities consisting of buildings, structures, durable
23 equipment, and land as authorized by subsection (1) of

1 Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to
2 State agencies for such purposes.

4 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
5 close of business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation
6 heretofore made in Article 475, Section 155 of Public Act 95-
7 348, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
8 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
9 Opportunity for grants pursuant but not limited to Article 8,
10 Article 9, or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

11 Section 60. The sum of \$13,801,931, or so much thereof
12 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
13 business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation heretofore
14 made for such purpose in Article 475, Section 156 of Public
15 Act 95-348, as amended, is reappropriated from the Fund for
16 Illinois' Future to the Department of Commerce and Economic
17 Opportunity for grants to units of government, educational
18 facilities and not-for-profit organizations for education and
19 training, infrastructure improvements and other capital
20 projects including but not limited to planning, construction,
21 reconstruction, equipment, utilities and vehicles, and all
22 costs associated with economic development programs,
23 community service programs, public health programs, public

1 safety programs, other programs and activities, and for
2 grants to other State agencies for any capital or operating
3 purposes.

6 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

7 GRANTS AND REIMBURSEMENTS - GENERAL OFFICE

8 Section 10. The sum of \$725,000, or so much thereof as
9 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act
10 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
11 administration and payment of grants to local governmental
12 units for the construction, maintenance, and improvement of
13 boat access areas.

14 Section 15. The sum of \$120,000, or so much thereof as
15 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act
16 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the purposes
17 of the Snowmobile Registration and Safety Act and for the
18 administration and payment of grants to local governmental
19 units for the construction, land acquisition, lease,
20 maintenance and improvement of snowmobile trails and access
21 areas.

1 Section 20. To the extent federal funds including
2 reimbursements are available for such purposes, the sum of
3 \$75,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is
4 appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund to the
5 Department of Natural Resources for all costs for
6 construction and development of facilities for transient,
7 non-trailerable recreational boats, including grants for such
8 purposes and authorized under the Boating Infrastructure
9 Grant Program.

10 Section 25. The sum of \$150,000, new appropriation, is
11 appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund to the
12 Department of Natural Resources for a grant to the Chain
13 O'Lakes - Fox River Waterway Management Agency for the
14 Agency's operational expenses.

15 Section 30. The following named sums, new appropriations,
16 or so much thereof as may be necessary, respectively, for the
17 objects and purposes hereinafter named, are appropriated to
