1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 6561

AMENDMENT NO. \_\_\_\_\_. Amend House Bill 6561, by deleting everything after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5 "ARTICLE 5

OFFICE OF THE ARCHITECT OF THE CAPITOL

Section 5. The amount of \$3,883, or so much of this amount as may be necessary and remains unexpended on June 30, 2008, from a reappropriation heretofore made for such purpose in Section 5 of Article 455 of Public Act 95-348, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the Office of the Architect of the Capital for plans, specifications, and continuation of work pursuant to the report and recommendations of the architectural, structural,

- 1 and mechanical surveys of the State Capitol Building. This is
- 2 for the continuation of the rehabilitation of the Capitol
- 3 Building.
- The sum of \$553,641, or so much thereof as 4 5 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business on June 30, 2008, from a reappropriation heretofore 6 made for such purposes in Section 10 of Article 455 of Public 7 Act 95-348, is reappropriated from the Capital Development 8 Fund to the Office of the Architect of the Capitol for 9 10 remodeling, planning, relocation, permanent equipment, and including 11 related expenses, architectural and 12 engineering fees associated with construction, for the remodeling of office space and other support areas under the 13 jurisdiction of the House of Representatives and the Senate. 14
- Section 15. No contract shall be entered into or obligation incurred for any expenditures from appropriations in Section 5 and 10 of this Article until after the purposes and amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.
