1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 6561

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend House Bill 6561, AS AMENDED,
3 with reference to page and line numbers of House Amendment
4 No. 1 on page 14, line 16 by changing "6,000,000" to
5 "15,000,000"; and

6 on page 14, line 17 by changing "\$20,000,000" to
7 "\$34,000,000"; and

8 on page 195, by inserting after line 9 the following:

9 "ARTICLE 125

10 Section 5. No monies may be expended from any
11 appropriation or reappropriation under any section of this
12 Article 125 unless a grant or contractual agreement for the

1 expenditure was agreed to in writing prior to June 30, 2007.
2 The Comptroller shall not approve the expenditure until he or
3 she receives a copy of that signed grant or contractual
4 agreement. The Comptroller shall keep a copy of any such
5 grant or contractual agreement he or she receives.

6 Section 10. The sum of \$4,580,704, or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
8 business on June 30, 2007, from a reappropriation heretofore
9 made in Article 96, Section 45 of Public Act 94-798, as
10 amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
11 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
12 grants and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8,
13 Article 9 or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

14 Section 15. The sum of \$3,130,040, or so much thereof as
15 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
16 business on June 30, 2007, from a reappropriation heretofore
17 made for such purpose in Article 96, Section 50 of Public Act
18 94-798, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
19 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
20 Opportunity for grants and loans pursuant but not limited to
21 Article 8 or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

22 Section 20. The sum of \$2,600,251, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
2 business on June 30, 2007, from a reappropriation heretofore
3 made in Article 96, Section 55 of Public Act 94-798, as
4 amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
5 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
6 grants and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8,
7 Article 9 or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

8 Section 25. The sum of \$5,567,122, or so much thereof as
9 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
10 business on June 30, 2007, from a reappropriation heretofore
11 made in Article 96, Section 60 of Public Act 94-798, as
12 amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
13 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
14 grants and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8,
15 Article 9 or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

16 Section 30. The sum of \$4,524,172, or so much thereof as
17 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
18 business on June 30, 2007, from a reappropriation heretofore
19 made in Article 96, Section 65 of Public Act 94-798, as
20 amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
21 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
22 grants and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8,
23 Article 9 or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

1 Section 35. The sum of \$1,975,000, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
3 business on June 30, 2007, from a reappropriation heretofore
4 made in Article 96, Section 70 of Public Act 94-798, is
5 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
6 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
7 associated with the Illinois Renewable Fuels Development Act.

8 Section 40. The sum of \$209,915,700, or so much thereof
9 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
10 business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation heretofore
11 made for such purpose in Article 96, Section 90 of Public Act
12 94-798, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
13 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
14 Opportunity for the purpose of making grants and loans to
15 local governments for planning, engineering, acquisition,
16 construction, reconstruction, development, improvement and
17 extension of the public infrastructure, and for any other
18 purposes authorized in subsection (a) of Section 4 of the
19 Build Illinois Bond Act and for grants to State agencies for
20 such purposes.

21 Section 45. The sum of \$47,500,000, or so much thereof
22 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of

1 business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation heretofore
2 made for such purpose in Article 96, Section 95 of Public Act
3 94-798, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
4 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
5 Opportunity for the purpose of fostering economic development
6 and increased employment and the well being of the citizens
7 of Illinois, and for any other purposes authorized in
8 subsection (b) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act
9 and for grants to State agencies for such purposes.

10 Section 50. The sum of \$30,646,616, or so much thereof
11 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
12 business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation heretofore
13 made for such purpose in Article 96, Section 100 of Public
14 Act 94-798, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
15 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
16 Opportunity for the development and improvement of
17 educational, scientific, technical and vocational programs
18 and facilities and the expansion of health and human
19 services, and for any other purposes authorized in subsection
20 (c) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act and for
21 grants to State agencies for such purposes.

22 Section 55. The sum of \$30,000,000, or so much thereof
23 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of

1 business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation heretofore
2 made for such purpose in Article 96, Section 105 of Public
3 Act 94-798, as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital
4 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
5 Opportunity for open spaces, recreational and conservation
6 purposes and the protection of land and for deposits into the
7 Conservation 2000 Projects Fund as authorized by subsection
8 (c) of Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act or for
9 grants to State agencies for such purposes.

10 Section 60. The sum of \$36,789,996, or so much thereof
11 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
12 business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation heretofore
13 made for such purpose in Article 96, Section 110 of Public
14 Act 94-798, as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital
15 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
16 Opportunity for grants to local governments for the
17 acquisition, financing, architectural planning, development,
18 alteration, installation, and construction of capital
19 facilities consisting of buildings, structures, durable
20 equipment, and land as authorized by subsection (1) of
21 Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to
22 State agencies for such purposes.

23 Section 65. The amount of \$10,000,000, or so much

1 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
2 close of business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation
3 heretofore made in Article 475, Section 130 of Public Act 95-
4 348, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to
5 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
6 grants to local governments for the acquisition, financing,
7 architectural planning, development, alteration,
8 installation, and construction of capital facilities
9 consisting of buildings, structures, durable equipment, and
10 land as authorized by subsection (1) of Section 3 of the
11 General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to State agencies
12 for such purposes.

13 Section 70. The amount of \$25,000,000, or so much
14 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
15 close of business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation
16 heretofore made in Article 95, Section 45 of Public Act 94-
17 798, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
18 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
19 Opportunity for grants pursuant but not limited to Article 8,
20 Article 9, or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

21 Section 75. The sum of \$13,801,931, or so much thereof
22 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
23 business on June 30, 2007, from an appropriation heretofore

1 made for such purpose in Article 96, Section 115 of Public
2 Act 94-798, as amended, is reappropriated from the Fund for
3 Illinois' Future to the Department of Commerce and Economic
4 Opportunity for grants to units of government, educational
5 facilities and not-for-profit organizations for education and
6 training, infrastructure improvements and other capital
7 projects including but not limited to planning, construction,
8 reconstruction, equipment, utilities and vehicles, and all
9 costs associated with economic development programs,
10 community service programs, public health programs, public
11 safety programs, other programs and activities, and for
12 grants to other State agencies for any capital or operating
13 purposes.

14 Section 80. The amount of \$4,493,003, or so much thereof
15 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
16 business on June 30, 2008, from a reappropriation heretofore
17 made in Article 510, Section 240 of Public Act 95-348, is
18 reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the
19 Capital Development Board for grants to units of local
20 government and other eligible entities for all costs
21 associated with land acquisition, construction and
22 rehabilitation projects.

23 Section 85. The sum of \$2,870,800, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, and remains unexpended at the close of
2 business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation heretofore
3 made for such purpose in Article 510, Section 247 of Public
4 Act 95-348, is appropriated from the Capital Development Fund
5 to the Capital Development Board for child care facilities,
6 mental and public health facilities, and facilities for the
7 care of disabled veterans and their spouses as authorized by
8 subsection (d) of Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond
9 Act or for grants to State agencies for such purposes.

10 Section 90. The sum of \$79,936,625, or so much thereof
11 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
12 business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation heretofore
13 made for such purpose in Article 510, Section 250 of Public
14 Act 95-348, is reappropriated from the Capital Development
15 Fund to the Capital Development Board for correctional
16 purposes at State prison and correctional centers as
17 authorized by subsection (b) of Section 3 of the General
18 Obligation Bond Act or for grants to State agencies for such
19 purposes.

20 Section 95. The sum of \$24,228,382, or so much thereof
21 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
22 business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation heretofore
23 made for such purpose in Article 510, Section 255 of Public

1 Act 95-348, is reappropriated from the Capital Development
2 Fund to the Capital Development Board for open spaces,
3 recreational and conservation purposes and the protection of
4 land and for deposits into the Conservation 2000 Projects
5 Fund as authorized by subsection (c) of Section 3 of the
6 General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to State agencies
7 for such purposes.

8 Section 100. The sum of \$9,831,030, or so much thereof
9 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
10 business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation heretofore
11 made for such purpose in Article 510, Section 260 of Public
12 Act 95-348, is reappropriated from the Capital Development
13 Fund to the Capital Development Board for child care
14 facilities, mental and public health facilities, and
15 facilities for the care of disabled veterans and their
16 spouses as authorized by subsection (d) of Section 3 of the
17 General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to State agencies
18 for such purposes.

19 Section 105. The sum of \$124,023,759, or so much thereof
20 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
21 business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation heretofore
22 made for such purpose in Article 510, Section 265 of Public
23 Act 95-348, is reappropriated from the Capital Development

1 Fund to the Capital Development Board for use by the State,
2 its departments, authorities, public corporations,
3 commissions and agencies as authorized by subsection (e) of
4 Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to
5 State agencies for such purposes."
