

1 AN ACT making appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 5

5 OFFICE OF THE ARCHITECT OF THE CAPITOL

6 Section 5. The amount of \$3,883, or so much of this
7 amount as may be necessary and remains unexpended on June 30,
8 2008, from a reappropriation heretofore made for such purpose
9 in Section 5 of Article 455 of Public Act 95-348, is
10 reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the
11 Office of the Architect of the Capitol for plans,
12 specifications, and continuation of work pursuant to the
13 report and recommendations of the architectural, structural,
14 and mechanical surveys of the State Capitol Building. This is
15 for the continuation of the rehabilitation of the Capitol
16 Building.

17 Section 10. The sum of \$553,641, or so much thereof as
18 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
19 business on June 30, 2008, from a reappropriation heretofore
20 made for such purposes in Section 10 of Article 455 of Public
21 Act 95-348, is reappropriated from the Capital Development

1 Fund to the Office of the Architect of the Capitol for
 2 remodeling, planning, relocation, permanent equipment, and
 3 other related expenses, including architectural and
 4 engineering fees associated with construction, for the
 5 remodeling of office space and other support areas under the
 6 jurisdiction of the House of Representatives and the Senate.

7 Section 15. No contract shall be entered into or
 8 obligation incurred for any expenditures from appropriations
 9 in Section 5 and 10 of this Article until after the purposes
 10 and amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

11 ARTICLE 10

12 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

13 Section 5. The following named amounts, or so much
 14 thereof as may be necessary are appropriated to the
 15 Department of Agriculture for repairs, maintenance, and
 16 capital improvements including construction, reconstruction,
 17 improvement, repair and installation of capital facilities,
 18 cost of planning, supplies, materials, equipment, services
 19 and all other expenses required to complete the work:

20 Payable from Agricultural Premium Fund:

21 For various projects at the State

22 Fairgrounds 600,000

1 For various projects at the DuQuoin State

2 Fairgrounds	<u>250,000</u>
3 Total	\$850,000

4 Section 15. The amount of \$2,612,500, or so much thereof
5 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Partners for
6 Conservation Projects Fund to the Department of Agriculture
7 for the Conservation Practices Cost-Share program.

8 ARTICLE 20

9 DEPARTMENT OF CENTRAL MANAGEMENT SERVICES

10 Section 5. The sum of \$8,748,300, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
12 business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation heretofore
13 made for such purpose in Article 465, Section 5 of Public Act
14 95-348, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
15 to the Department of Central Management Services for
16 Information Technology infrastructure expenses including but
17 not limited to related hardware and equipment.

18 Section 10. No contract shall be entered into or
19 obligation incurred for any expenditures from appropriations
20 in Section 5 of this Article until after the purposes and
21 amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

1 ARTICLE 25

2 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

3 Section 5. The sum of \$3,000,000, or so much thereof as
4 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Port Development
5 Revolving Loan Fund to the Department of Commerce and
6 Economic Opportunity for grants and loans associated with the
7 Port Development Revolving Loan Program pursuant to 30 ILCS
8 750/9-11.

9 ARTICLE 30

10 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

11 Section 5. The sum of \$319,116, or so much thereof as
12 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
13 business on June 30, 2008, from a reappropriation heretofore
14 made in Article 475, Section 30 of Public Act 95-348, is
15 reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the
16 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for Coal
17 Development Programs.

18 Section 10. The sum of \$50,000,000, or so much thereof
19 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
20 business on June 30, 2008, from a reappropriation heretofore

1 made in Article 475, Section 35 of Public Act 95-348, is
2 reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the
3 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
4 pursuant to 20 ILCS 605/605-332 - Coal Revival Program.

5 Section 40. The sum of \$1,975,000, or so much thereof as
6 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
7 business on June 30, 2008, from a reappropriation heretofore
8 made in Article 475, Section 70 of Public Act 95-348, is
9 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
10 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
11 associated with the Illinois Renewable Fuels Development Act.

12 Section 45. The sum of \$13,000,000, or so much thereof
13 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
14 business on June 30, 2008, from a reappropriation heretofore
15 made in Article 475, Section 75 of Public Act 95-348, is
16 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
17 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant
18 to the Argonne National Laboratory for the Rare Isotope
19 Accelerator for bondable infrastructure improvements. This
20 appropriated amount shall be in addition to any other
21 appropriated amounts which can be expended for these
22 purposes.

1 Section 75. The amount of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof
2 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
3 business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation heretofore
4 made in Article 475, Section 120 of Public Act 95-348, is
5 reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the
6 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the
7 specific purposes of acquisition, development, construction,
8 reconstruction, improvement, financing, architectural and
9 technical planning and installation of capital facilities
10 consisting of buildings, structures, durable equipment, and
11 land for the purpose of capital development of coal resources
12 within the State.

13 Section 80. The amount of \$17,000,000, or so much
14 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
15 close of business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation
16 heretofore made in Article 475, Section 125 of Public Act 95-
17 348, is reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the
18 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the
19 specific purposes of acquisition, development, construction,
20 reconstruction, improvement, financing, architectural and
21 technical planning and installation of capital facilities
22 consisting of buildings, structures, durable equipment, and
23 land for the purpose of capital development of coal resources
24 within the State, including but not limited to a grant for a

1 commercial scale project that produces electric power and
2 hydrogen and demonstrates underground storage of up to 1
3 million metric tons annually of carbon dioxide.

4 Section 90. The amount of \$7,000,000, or so much thereof
5 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
6 business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation heretofore
7 made in Article 475, Section 135 of Public Act 95-348, is
8 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
9 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant
10 to Argonne National Laboratory for the Advanced Protein
11 Crystallization Facility.

12 Section 95. The amount of \$15,000,000, or so much
13 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
14 close of business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation
15 heretofore made in Article 475, Section 140 of Public Act 95-
16 348, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to
17 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
18 grant for the Illinois Science and Technology Park.

19 Section 100. The amount of \$2,000,000, or so much
20 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
21 close of business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation
22 heretofore made in Article 475, Section 145 of Public Act 95-

1 348, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to
2 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
3 grant to the Illinois Institute of Technology for the
4 biomedical research complex.

5 Section 105. The amount of \$3,000,000, or so much
6 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
7 close of business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation
8 heretofore made in Article 475, Section 150 of Public Act 95-
9 348, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to
10 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
11 grant to Fermi National Accelerator Laboratory for the
12 Illinois Accelerator Research Center.

13 Section 120. The amount of \$20,000,000, or so much
14 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
15 close of business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation
16 heretofore made in Article 475, Section 160 of Public Act 95-
17 348, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to
18 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
19 grants associated with the Illinois Renewable Fuels
20 Development Act.

21 Section 125. The amount of \$15,000,000, or so much
22 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the

1 close of business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation
2 heretofore made in Article 475, Section 165 of Public Act 95-
3 348, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to
4 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
5 grants associated with the redevelopment of brownfield sites.

6 Section 130. No contract shall be entered into or
7 obligation incurred or any expenditure made from any
8 appropriation herein made in this Article until after the
9 purpose and amounts have been approved in writing by the
10 Governor.

11 ARTICLE 35

12 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

13 GRANTS AND REIMBURSEMENTS - GENERAL OFFICE

14 Section 10. The sum of \$725,000, or so much thereof as
15 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act
16 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
17 administration and payment of grants to local governmental
18 units for the construction, maintenance, and improvement of
19 boat access areas.

20 Section 15. The sum of \$120,000, or so much thereof as
21 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act

1 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the purposes
2 of the Snowmobile Registration and Safety Act and for the
3 administration and payment of grants to local governmental
4 units for the construction, land acquisition, lease,
5 maintenance and improvement of snowmobile trails and access
6 areas.

7 Section 20. To the extent federal funds including
8 reimbursements are available for such purposes, the sum of
9 \$75,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is
10 appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund to the
11 Department of Natural Resources for all costs for
12 construction and development of facilities for transient,
13 non-trailerable recreational boats, including grants for such
14 purposes and authorized under the Boating Infrastructure
15 Grant Program.

16 Section 25. The sum of \$150,000, new appropriation, is
17 appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund to the
18 Department of Natural Resources for a grant to the Chain
19 O'Lakes - Fox River Waterway Management Agency for the
20 Agency's operational expenses.

21 Section 30. The following named sums, new appropriations,
22 or so much thereof as may be necessary, respectively, for the

1 objects and purposes hereinafter named, are appropriated to
2 the Department of Natural Resources:

3 Payable from State Boating Act Fund:

4 For multiple use facilities and
5 programs for boating purposes
6 provided by the Department of Natural
7 Resources, including construction
8 and development, all costs for supplies,
9 materials, labor, land acquisition,
10 services, studies and all other
11 expenses required to comply with the
12 intent of this appropriation1,500,000

13 Payable from State Parks Fund:

14 For multiple use facilities and programs
15 for park and trail purposes provided by
16 the Department of Natural Resources, including
17 construction and development, all costs
18 for supplies, materials, labor, land
19 acquisition, services, studies, and
20 all other expenses required to comply with
21 the intent of this appropriation150,000

22 Section 35. The sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as
23 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish
24 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for acquisition

1 and development, including grants, for the implementation of
 2 the North American Waterfowl Management Plan within the
 3 Dominion of Canada or the United States which specifically
 4 provides waterfowl for the Mississippi Flyway.

5 Section 40. To the extent federal funds including
 6 reimbursements are available for such purposes, the sum of
 7 \$100,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is
 8 appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish Fund to the
 9 Department of Natural Resources for construction and
 10 renovation of waste reception facilities for recreational
 11 boaters, including grants for such purposes authorized under
 12 the Clean Vessel Act.

13 Section 50. The following named sums, or so much thereof
 14 as may be necessary, respectively, herein made either
 15 independently or in cooperation with the Federal Government
 16 or any agency thereof, any municipal corporation, or
 17 political subdivision of the State, or with any public or
 18 private corporation, organization, or individual, are
 19 appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources for
 20 refunds and the purposes stated:

21 Payable from Forest Reserve Fund:

22 For U.S. Forest Service Program500,000

1 Section 55. The sum of \$110,000, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Plugging and
3 Restoration Fund to the Department of Natural Resources,
4 Office of Mines and Minerals for the Landowner Grant Program
5 authorized under the Oil and Gas Act, as amended by Public
6 Act 90-0260.

7 Section 60. The sum of \$1,500,000, or so much thereof as
8 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
9 Natural Resources from the Abandoned Mined Lands Set Aside
10 Fund for grants and contracts to conduct research, planning
11 and construction to eliminate hazards created by abandoned
12 mines and any other expenses necessary for emergency
13 response.

14 Section 65. The sum of \$99,000, or so much thereof as
15 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
16 Natural Resources from the State Furbearer Fund for the
17 conservation of fur bearing mammals in accordance with the
18 provisions of Section 5/1.32 of the "Wildlife Code", as now
19 or hereafter amended.

20 Section 70. The following named sums, new appropriations,
21 or so much thereof as may be necessary, respectively, for the
22 objects and purposes hereinafter named, are appropriated to

1 the Department of Natural Resources:

2 Payable from Natural Areas Acquisition Fund:

3 For the acquisition, preservation and
 4 stewardship of natural areas, including habitats
 5 for endangered and threatened species, high
 6 quality natural communities, wetlands
 7 and other areas with unique or unusual
 8 natural heritage qualities15,000,000

9 Section 75. The sum of \$34,000,000, or so much thereof
 10 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Open Space
 11 Lands Acquisition and Development Fund to the Department of
 12 Natural Resources for expenses connected with and to make
 13 grants to local governments and to distressed communities as
 14 provided in the "Open Space Lands Acquisition and Development
 15 Act".

16 Section 80. The sum of \$495,000, or so much thereof as
 17 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Pheasant
 18 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
 19 conservation of pheasants in accordance with the provisions
 20 of Section 5/1.31 of the "Wildlife Code", as now or hereafter
 21 amended.

1 Section 85. The sum of \$1,215,000, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Habitat
3 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
4 preservation and maintenance of high quality habitat lands in
5 accordance with the provisions of the "Habitat Endowment
6 Act", as now or hereafter amended.

7 Section 90. The sum of \$225,000, or so much thereof as
8 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Habitat
9 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
10 preservation and maintenance of a high quality fish and
11 wildlife habitat and to promote the heritage of outdoor
12 sports in Illinois from revenue derived from the sale of
13 Sportsmen Series license plates.

14 Section 95. The sum of \$800,000, or so much thereof as
15 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
16 Natural Resources for expenditure by the Office of Water
17 Resources from the Flood Control Land Lease Fund for
18 disbursement of monies received pursuant to Act of Congress
19 dated September 3, 1954 (68 Statutes 1266, same as appears in
20 Section 701c-3, Title 33, United States Code Annotated),
21 provided such disbursement shall be in compliance with 15
22 ILCS 515/1 Illinois Compiled Statutes.

1 Section 100. The following named sums, or so much
 2 thereof as may be necessary, respectively, herein made either
 3 independently or in cooperation with the Federal Government
 4 or any agency thereof, any municipal corporation, or
 5 political subdivision of the State, or with any public or
 6 private corporation, organization, or individual, are
 7 appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources for
 8 refunds and the purposes stated:

9 Payable from Land and Water Recreation Fund:

10 For Outdoor Recreation Programs\$6,200,000

11 Section 105. The sum of \$600,000, or so much thereof as
 12 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Off Highway
 13 Vehicle Trails Fund to the Department of Natural Resources
 14 for grants to units of local governments, not-for-profit
 15 organizations, and other groups to operate, maintain and
 16 acquire land for off-highway vehicle trails and parks as
 17 provided for in the Recreational Trails of Illinois Act,
 18 including administration, enforcement, planning and
 19 implementation of this Act.

20 Section 110. The following named sums, or so much
 21 thereof as may be necessary, respectively, herein made either
 22 independently or in cooperation with the Federal Government
 23 or any agency thereof, any municipal corporation, or

1 political subdivision of the State, or with any public or
2 private corporation, organization, or individual, are
3 appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources for
4 refunds and the purposes stated:

5 Payable from Federal Title IV Fire

6 Protection Assistance Fund:

7 For Rural Community Fire Protection

8 Programs\$325,000

9 Section 115. The sum of \$80,000, or so much thereof as
10 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Snowmobile Trail
11 Establishment Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
12 the administration and payment of grants to nonprofit
13 snowmobile clubs and organizations for construction,
14 maintenance, and rehabilitation of snowmobile trails and
15 areas for the use of snowmobiles.

16 Section 120. The sum of \$625,000, or so much thereof as
17 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Forestry
18 Development Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
19 the payment of grants to timber growers for implementation of
20 acceptable forestry management practices as provided in the
21 "Illinois Forestry Development Act" as now or hereafter
22 amended.

1 Section 125. To the extent Federal Funds including
2 reimbursements are made available for such purposes, the sum
3 of \$300,000, is appropriated from the Illinois Forestry
4 Development Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
5 Forest Stewardship Technical Assistance.

6 Section 130. The sum of \$144,000, or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory
8 Waterfowl Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources
9 for the payment of grants for the implementation of the North
10 American Waterfowl Management Plan within the Dominion of
11 Canada or the United States which specifically provides
12 waterfowl to the Mississippi Flyway as provided in the
13 "Wildlife Code", as amended.

14 Section 135. The sum of \$144,000, or so much thereof as
15 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory
16 Waterfowl Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources
17 for the payment of grants for the development of waterfowl
18 propagation areas within the Dominion of Canada or the United
19 States which specifically provide waterfowl for the
20 Mississippi Flyway as provided in the "Wildlife Code", as
21 amended.

22 Section 140. The sum of \$450,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory
2 Waterfowl Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources
3 for the purpose of attracting waterfowl and improving public
4 migratory waterfowl areas within the State.

5 Section 145. The sum of \$3,000,000, or so much thereof
6 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and
7 Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
8 grants to units of local government for the acquisition and
9 development of bike paths.

10 Section 150. The sum of \$500,000, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and
12 Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
13 land acquisition, development and maintenance of bike paths
14 and all other related expenses connected with the
15 acquisition, development and maintenance of bike paths.

16 Section 155. The sum of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof
17 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and
18 Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
19 the development and maintenance, and other related expenses
20 of recreational trails and trail-related projects authorized
21 under the Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act of
22 1991, provided such amount shall not exceed funds to be made

1 available for such purposes from state or federal sources.

2 Section 160. The following named sum, new appropriation,
3 or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the object and
4 purpose hereinafter named, is appropriated to the Department
5 of Natural Resources:

6 Payable from the Park and Conservation Fund:

7 For multiple use facilities and programs
8 for park and trail purposes provided by
9 the Department of Natural Resources, including
10 construction and development, all costs
11 for supplies, materials, labor, land
12 acquisition, services, studies, and
13 all other expenses required to comply with
14 the intent of this appropriation1,000,000

15 Section 165. The following named sums, new
16 appropriations, or so much thereof as may be necessary,
17 respectively, for the objects and purposes hereinafter named,
18 are appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources:

21 For rehabilitation, reconstruction, repair,

2 Section 170. The sum of \$6,000,000, or so much thereof
3 as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
4 Natural Resources from the Abandoned Mined Lands Reclamation
5 Council Federal Trust Fund for grants and contracts to
6 conduct research, planning and construction to eliminate
7 hazards created by abandoned mines, and any other expenses
8 necessary for emergency response.

9 ARTICLE 40

10 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

11 Section 5. The sum of \$4,028,521, or so much thereof as
12 may be necessary and as remains unexpended at the close of
13 business on June 30, 2008, from appropriations heretofore
14 made in Article 480, Section 10 and Article 485, Section 5,
15 of Public Act 95-348, as amended, is reappropriated from the
16 State Boating Act Fund to the Department of Natural Resources
17 for the administration and payment of grants to local
18 governmental units for the construction, maintenance, and
19 improvement of boat access areas.

20 Section 15. The sum of \$435,003, or so much thereof as
21 may be necessary and as remains unexpended at the close of

1 business on June 30, 2008, from appropriations heretofore
2 made in Article 480, Section 15, and Article 485, Section 15,
3 of Public Act 95-348, as amended, is reappropriated from the
4 State Boating Act Fund to the Department of Natural Resources
5 for the purposes of the Snowmobile Registration and Safety
6 Act and for the administration and payment of grants to local
7 governmental units for the construction, land acquisition,
8 lease, maintenance and improvement of snowmobile trails and
9 access areas.

10 Section 30. To the extent federal funds including
11 reimbursements are available for such purposes, the sum of
12 \$1,159,914, or so much thereof as may be necessary and
13 remains unexpended at the close of business on June 30, 2008,
14 from appropriations heretofore made in Article 480, Section
15 20 and Article 485, Section 30 of Public Act 95-348, as
16 amended, is reappropriated from the State Boating Act Fund to
17 the Department of Natural Resources for all costs for
18 construction and development of facilities for transient,
19 non-trailerable recreational boats, including grants for such
20 purposes and authorized under the Boating Infrastructure
21 Grant Program.

22 Section 35. The following named sums, or so much thereof
23 as may be necessary, respectively, and as remains unexpended

17 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
18 business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation heretofore
19 made for such purpose in Article 545, Section 55 of Public
20 Act 95-348, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
21 Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency for financial
22 assistance to municipalities with designated River Edge
23 Redevelopment Zones for brownfields redevelopment in

1 accordance with Section 58.13 of the Environmental Protection
2 Act, including costs in prior years.

3 Section 60. The sum of \$8,462,700, or so much thereof as
4 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
5 business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation heretofore
6 made for such purpose in Article 545, Section 60 of Public
7 Act 95-348, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
8 Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency for the
9 protection, preservation, restoration and conservation of
10 environmental and natural resources, for deposits into the
11 Water Revolving Fund, and for any other purposes authorized

19 Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency for the
20 protection, preservation, restoration and conservation of

22 Water Revolving Fund, and for any other purposes authorized
23 in subsection (d) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act

1 and for grants to State Agencies for such purposes.

8 Section 5. The sum of \$143,000, or so much thereof as
9 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
10 business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation heretofore
11 made in Article 550, Section 10 of Public Act 95-348, as
12 amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
13 to the Historic Preservation Agency for support facilities,
14 acquisition or improvements for Sugar Loaf and/or Fox Mounds
15 or other properties within the Cahokia Mounds National
16 Historic Landmark Boundary.

17 Section 10. No contract shall be entered into or
18 obligation incurred for any expenditures from appropriations
19 in Section 5 of this Article until after the purposes and
20 amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

3 Section 5. The sum of \$9,000,000, or so much thereof as

8 interest to the Illinois Rural Bond Bank.

12 purpose of making loans to fire departments, fire protection

2 amended, is reappropriated from the Fire Truck Revolving Loan
3 Fund to the Illinois Finance Authority for the purpose of
4 making loans to fire departments, fire protection districts,
5 and township fire departments as successor in interest to the
6 Illinois Rural Bond Bank, pursuant to Section 845-75 of
7 Public Act 93-0205.

8 ARTICLE 120

20 facilities, mental and public health facilities, and
21 facilities for the care of disabled veterans and their
22 spouses as authorized by subsection (d) of Section 3 of the
23 General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to State agencies

1 for such purposes.

Section 105. The sum of \$124,023,759, or so much thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation heretofore made for such purpose in Article 510, Section 265 of Public Act 95-348, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the Capital Development Board for use by the State, its departments, authorities, public corporations, commissions and agencies as authorized by subsection (e) of Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to State agencies for such purposes.
