1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 6565

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend House Bill 6565, by deleting
3 everything after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu
4 thereof the following:

5 "ARTICLE 1

6 Section 55. The following named amounts, or so much
7 thereof as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects
8 and purposes named in this Section, are appropriated to the
9 Attorney General to meet the ordinary and contingent expenses
10 of the Attorney General:

11 OPERATIONS

12 Payable from the Violent Crime Victims Assistance Fund:

13 For Awards and Grants under the Violent

14 Crime Victims Assistance Act8,000,000

1	For Sheriffs' Fees for Conveying Prisoners	337,400

7 Section 10. The sum of \$7,500,000, or so much thereof as
8 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
9 Corrections from the General Revenue Fund for a grant to the
10 President of the Cook County Board of Commissioners for
11 expenses associated with the operations of the Cook County
12 Juvenile Detention Center.

13 Section 15. The amount of \$1,500,000, or so much thereof
14 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
15 Fund to the Department of Corrections for a grant to the Cook
16 County Sheriff's Office for the expenses of the Cook County
17 Boot Camp.

18 Section 20. The amount of \$790,000, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
20 Corrections from the General Revenue Fund for re-entry,
21 transitional and related services.

1 Section 25. The sum of \$4,000,000, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
3 Corrections from the General Revenue Fund for expenses
4 associated with 40 community based re-entry programs
5 throughout the State.

6 Section 30. The amount of \$1,500,000, or so much thereof
7 as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
8 Corrections from the General Revenue Fund for expenses
9 associated with the operation of the Franklin County Juvenile
10 Detention Center, including a juvenile methamphetamine pilot
11 program.

12 Section 35. The sum of \$1,200,000, or so much thereof as
13 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
14 Corrections from the General Revenue Fund for expenses
15 associated with the operation of a pilot community-based
16 diversion program for non-violent female offenders who are
17 mothers.

18 Section 40. The amount of \$12,500,000, or so much
19 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated to the
20 Department of Corrections from the General Revenue Fund for a
21 grant to Operation Ceasefire to be used in the following
22 locations:

3 Section 45. The amount of \$150,000, or so much thereof as
 4 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
 5 Corrections from the General Revenue Fund for all costs
 6 associated with staff and administrative support for the
 7 Long-Term Prisoners Study Committee, pursuant to House Joint
 8 Resolution 80 from the 94th General Assembly.

9 Section 50. The sum of \$600,000, or so much thereof as
 10 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
 11 Corrections from the General Revenue Fund for a pilot program
 12 to provide one-to-one mentoring to 300 children whose parent
 13 or custodial family member is incarcerated in or on parole
 14 from a state or federal correctional facility.

15 ARTICLE 3

16 Section 5. The following named amounts, or so much
 17 thereof as may be necessary, are appropriated to the
 18 Department of Juvenile Justice for the objects and purposes
 19 hereinafter named:

20 Payable from the General Revenue Fund:

6 Section 10. The sum of \$450,000, or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
8 Juvenile Justice from the General Revenue Fund for four
9 positions, travel, and other costs for a high-impact,
10 professional training and development program.

11 Section 15. The sum of \$130,000, or so much thereof as
12 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
13 Juvenile Justice from the General Revenue Fund for
14 recreational equipment and sports supplies.

15 Section 20. The sum of \$375,000, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
17 Juvenile Justice from the General Revenue Fund to hire an
18 additional six Leisure Time Activity Specialists.

19 ARTICLE 4

20 Section 5. The following named amounts, or so much

1 thereof as may be necessary, respectively, are appropriated
2 for the ordinary and contingent expenses of the Office of the
3 State Fire Marshal, as follows:

14 Section 10. The sum of \$1,000, or so much thereof as may
15 be necessary, is appropriated from the Fire Prevention Fund
16 to the Office of the State Fire Marshal for grants available
17 for the development of new fire districts.

18 Section 15. The sum of \$522,500, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Underground
20 Storage Tank Fund to the Office of the State Fire Marshal for
21 a grant to the City of Chicago for Administrative Costs
22 incurred as a result of the State's Underground Storage
23 Program.

1 Section 20. The sum of \$498,500, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Fire Prevention
3 Fund to the Office of the State Fire Marshal for grants
4 available for the development of local government fire
5 prevention.

6 Section 25. The sum of \$125,000, or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Fire Prevention
8 Fund to the Office of the State Fire Marshal for grants
9 available for costs and services related to ILEAS/MABAS
10 administration.

11 Section 30. The sum of \$675,000, or so much thereof as
12 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Fire Prevention
13 Fund to the Office of the State Fire Marshal for grants
14 available for the NITE project.

15 Section 35. The sum of \$5,000, or so much thereof as may
16 be necessary, is appropriated from the Cigarette Fire Safety
17 Standard Fund to the Office of the State Fire Marshal for the
18 purpose of fire safety and prevention programs.

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ARTICLE 5

1 Section 5. The sum of \$37,000,000, or so much thereof as
 2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Criminal Justice
 3 Trust Fund to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information
 4 Authority for awards and grants to local units of government
 5 and non-profit organizations.

6 Section 10. The sum of \$12,000,000, or so much thereof
 7 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Criminal
 8 Justice Trust Fund to the Illinois Criminal Justice
 9 Information Authority for awards and grants to state
 10 agencies.

11 Section 15. The following named sums, or so much thereof
 12 as may be necessary, are appropriated to the Illinois
 13 Criminal Justice Information Authority for activities
 14 undertaken in support of federal assistance programs
 15 administered by units of state and local government and non-
 16 profit organizations:

21 Section 20. The following named amounts, or so much

 4 organizations for activities undertaken in support of
 5 investigating issues in criminal justice and for undertaking
 6 other criminal justice information projects:

12 Section 25. The following named amounts, or so much
 13 thereof as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects
 14 and purposes hereinafter named, are appropriated to the
 15 Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for awards,
 16 grants and operational support to implement the Motor Vehicle
 17 Theft Prevention Act:

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21 Section 30. The sum of \$10,000,000, or so much thereof
 22 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Criminal
 23 Justice Trust Fund to the Illinois Criminal Justice

1 Information Authority for awards and grants to state agencies
2 and units of local government, to include operational
3 activities and programs undertaken by the Authority, in
4 support of Federal Crime Bill Initiatives.

5 Section 35. The sum of \$4,500,000, or so much thereof as
6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Juvenile
7 Accountability Incentive Block Grant Trust Fund to the
8 Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for awards
9 and grants to state agencies and units of local government,
10 including operational expenses of the Authority in support of
11 the Juvenile Accountability Incentive Block Grant program.

12 Section 40. The sum of \$250,000, or so much thereof as
13 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
14 Fund to the Criminal Justice Information Authority for costs
15 and expenses related to a capital punishment reform study
16 committee.

17 Section 45. The sum of \$240,000, or so much thereof as
18 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
19 Fund to the Criminal Justice Information Authority for costs
20 and expenses related to the Downstate Innocence Project.

21 Section 50. The sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
2 Fund to the Criminal Justice Information Authority for costs
3 and expenses related to the South Suburban Major Crimes Task
4 Force.

5 ARTICLE 7

6 Section 5. The sum of \$1,200,000, or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Violence
8 Prevention Fund to the Illinois Violence Prevention Authority
9 for the purpose of awarding grants under the provisions of
10 the Violence Prevention Act of 1995.

11 Section 10. The sum of \$2,127,500, or so much thereof as
12 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
13 Fund to the Illinois Violence Prevention Authority for the
14 purpose of awarding grants under the provisions of the
15 Violence Prevention Act of 1995.

16 Section 15. The amount of \$526,500, or so much of that
17 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General
18 Revenue Fund to the Illinois Violence Prevention Authority
19 for the Illinois Family Violence Coordinating Council Program
20 for the purpose of awarding grants.

1 Section 20. The amount of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof
2 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
3 Fund to the Illinois Violence Prevention Authority for all
4 costs associated with Bullying Prevention.

5 ARTICLE 998

6 Section 998. Each of the amounts appropriated in this
7 Act (after all actions by the Governor and the General
8 Assembly) controls over any lower amount appropriated in any
9 other Public Act (after all actions by the Governor and the
10 General Assembly) for the same purpose unless that other
11 Public Act expressly states otherwise.

12 ARTICLE 999

13 Section 999. Effective Date. This Act takes effect
14 July 1, 2008."
