1 HOUSE RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The beaches of Lake Michigan provide a significant 2 source of tourism income for the State of Illinois and other 3 4 states bordering the Lake; and 5 WHEREAS, The British Petroleum oil refinery in Whiting, 6 Indiana is planning an expansion that would increase the 7 refinery's discharges into the Lake significantly, including 8 54% more ammonia and 35% more sludge on a daily basis; and 9 WHEREAS, The total amount of ammonia that British Petroleum 10 will be discharging into the Lake on a daily basis is 1,584 pounds and the total amount of sludge that British Petroleum 11 will be discharging into the Lake on a daily basis is 4,925 12 13 pounds; and 14 WHEREAS, Ammonia promotes algae blooms that can kill fish and trigger beach closings on the Lake; and 15 16 WHEREAS, The sludge that will be discharged into the Lake 17 by British Petroleum is full of concentrated heavy metals, 18 including mercury; and 19 WHEREAS, Last year, 81% of Illinois beaches were declared

unsafe due to algae and other pollution problems; therefore, be
