Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Highway Code is amended by adding Section 4-220 as follows:

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7 Sec. 4-220. Bicycle and pedestrian ways.

within one mile of an urban area.

- (a) Bicycle and pedestrian ways shall be given full consideration in the planning and development of transportation facilities, including the incorporation of such ways into State plans and programs. Bicycle and pedestrian ways may be established in conjunction with the construction, reconstruction, or other change of any State transportation facility, and special emphasis may be given to projects in or
- 16 <u>(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a),</u>
- bicycle and pedestrian ways are not required to be established:
- 18 <u>(1) where their establishment would be contrary to</u>
 19 public safety;
- 20 (2) when the cost would be excessively
 21 disproportionate to the need or probable use;
- 22 (3) where other available means or factors indicate an absence of need; or

1	(4) in pavement resurfacing projects that do not widen

6	(c) Exceptions for the non-inclusion of bicycle and

12	(e) Beginning July 1, 2007, this Section shall apply to
