105 ILCS 230/5-5

Amends the School Construction Law. Provides that the grant index may be increased by 0.05 for school construction projects that receive certification from the United States Green Building Council's Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design Green Building Rating System, the Green Building Initiative's Green Globes Green Building Rating System, or green building standards approved by the Capital Development Board. Effective July 1, 2007.

1 AN ACT concerning education.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The School Construction Law is amended by 5 changing Section 5-5 as follows:

6 (105 ILCS 230/5-5)

7 Sec. 5-5. Definitions. As used in this Article:

"Approved school construction bonds" mean bonds that were 8 9 approved by referendum after January 1, 1996 but prior to 10 January 1, 1998 as provided in Sections 19-2 through 19-7 of the School Code to provide funds for the acquisition, 11 12 development, construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation, 13 improvement, architectural planning, and installation of 14 capital facilities consisting of buildings, structures, durable-equipment, and land for educational purposes. 15

16 "Grant index" means a figure for each school district equal 17 to one minus the ratio of the district's equalized assessed valuation per pupil in average daily attendance to the 18 19 equalized assessed valuation per pupil in average daily attendance of the district located at the 90th percentile for 20 21 all districts of the same category. For the purpose of 22 calculating the grant index, school districts are grouped into 2 categories, Category I and Category II. Category I consists 23

of elementary and unit school districts. The equalized assessed 1 2 valuation per pupil in average daily attendance of each school district in Category I shall be computed using its grades 3 kindergarten through 8 average daily attendance figure. A unit 4 5 school district's Category I grant index shall be used for projects or portions of projects constructed for elementary 6 school pupils. Category II consists of high school and unit 7 8 school districts. The equalized assessed valuation per pupil in 9 average daily attendance of each school district in Category II 10 shall be computed using its grades 9 through 12 average daily 11 attendance figure. A unit school district's Category II grant 12 index shall be used for projects or portions of projects constructed for high school pupils. The changes made by this 13 14 amendatory Act of the 92nd General Assembly apply to all grants 15 made on or after the effective date of this amendatory Act, 16 provided that for grants not yet made on the effective date of 17 this amendatory Act but made in fiscal year 2001 and for grants made in fiscal year 2002, the grant index for a school district 18 shall be the greater of (i) the grant index as calculated under 19 20 this Law on or after the effective date of this amendatory Act or (ii) the grant index as calculated under this Law before the 21 22 effective date of this amendatory Act. The grant index shall be 23 no less than 0.35 and no greater than 0.75 for each district; provided that the grant index for districts whose equalized 24 25 assessed valuation per pupil in average daily attendance is at the 99th percentile and above for all districts of the same 26

type shall be 0.00. <u>The grant index may be increased by 0.05</u> for school construction projects that receive certification from the United States Green Building Council's Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design Green Building Rating System, the Green Building Initiative's Green Globes Green Building Rating System, or green building standards approved by the Capital Development Board.

8 "School construction project" means the acquisition, 9 development, construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation, 10 improvement, architectural planning, and installation of 11 capital facilities consisting of buildings, structures, 12 durable equipment, and land for educational purposes.

"School district" includes a cooperative high school, which shall be considered a high school district for the purpose of calculating its grant index.

16 "School maintenance project" means a project, other than a 17 school construction project, intended to provide for the 18 maintenance or upkeep of buildings or structures for 19 educational purposes, but does not include ongoing operational 20 costs.
