SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

720 ILCS 5/16G-15.5 new

Amends the Criminal Code of 1961. Creates the offense of prescription theft. Provides that a person commits the offense when he or she knowingly: (1) alters a properly issued prescription; (2) possesses a blank prescription or prescriptions without the written permission of a licensed prescriber; or (3) possesses or attempts to fill a prescription not issued by a licensed prescriber. Provides that a violation is a Class 4 felony for a first offense and a Class 3 felony for a second or subsequent offense.

- Section 5. The Criminal Code of 1961 is amended by adding Section 16G-15.5 as follows:

- 7 <u>Sec. 16G-15.5. Prescription theft.</u>
- 8 (a) A person commits the offense of prescription theft when
- 9 <u>he or she knowingly:</u>
- 10 <u>(1) alters a properly issued prescription;</u>
- 11 (2) possesses a blank prescription or prescriptions
- 12 <u>without the written permission of a licensed prescriber; or</u>
- 13 (3) possesses or attempts to fill a prescription not
- 14 <u>issued by a licensed prescriber.</u>
- (b) Knowledge shall be determined by an evaluation of all
- 16 <u>circumstances surrounding possession of a blank prescription</u>
- or possession of or attempted use of a prescription altered or
- 18 <u>not issued by a licensed prescriber.</u>
- (c) Sentence. A person convicted of prescription theft in
- violation of subsection (a) shall be sentenced as follows:
- 21 (1) Prescription theft is a Class 4 felony.
- 22 (2) A person who has been previously convicted of
- 23 prescription theft who is convicted of a second or

subsequent offense is guilty of a Class 3 felony.

(d) For the purposes of this Section, "licensed prescriber" means a physician licensed to practice medicine in all its branches; a licensed podiatrist; a therapeutically certified optometrist; a licensed dentist; a licensed physician assistant who has been delegated prescriptive authority by a supervising physician; or a licensed advanced practice registered nurse who has a written collaborative agreement with a collaborating physician that authorizes prescriptive authority.
