1 AMENDMENT TO SENATE BILL 1116

2 AMENDMENT NO. \_\_\_\_\_. Amend Senate Bill 1116, AS AMENDED,  
3 by replacing everything after the enacting clause with the  
4 following:

5 "ARTICLE 5  
6 OFFICE OF THE ARCHITECT OF THE CAPITOL

7 Section 5. The amount of \$3,883, or so much of this  
8 amount as may be necessary and remains unexpended on June 30,  
9 2008, from a reappropriation heretofore made for such purpose  
10 in Section 5 of Article 455 of Public Act 95-348, is  
11 reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the  
12 Office of the Architect of the Capitol for plans,  
13 specifications, and continuation of work pursuant to the  
14 report and recommendations of the architectural, structural,

1 and mechanical surveys of the State Capitol Building. This is  
2 for the continuation of the rehabilitation of the Capitol  
3 Building.

4 Section 10. The sum of \$553,641, or so much thereof as  
5 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of  
6 business on June 30, 2008, from a reappropriation heretofore  
7 made for such purposes in Section 10 of Article 455 of Public  
8 Act 95-348, is reappropriated from the Capital Development  
9 Fund to the Office of the Architect of the Capitol for  
10 remodeling, planning, relocation, permanent equipment, and  
11 other related expenses, including architectural and  
12 engineering fees associated with construction, for the  
13 remodeling of office space and other support areas under the  
14 jurisdiction of the House of Representatives and the Senate.

15 Section 15. No contract shall be entered into or  
16 obligation incurred for any expenditures from appropriations  
17 in Section 5 and 10 of this Article until after the purposes  
18 and amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

21 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

1 Section 5. The following named amounts, or so much  
 2 thereof as may be necessary are appropriated to the  
 3 Department of Agriculture for repairs, maintenance, and

 5 improvement, repair and installation of capital facilities,  
 6 cost of planning, supplies, materials, equipment, services  
 7 and all other expenses required to complete the work:

18 Section 20. The amount of \$2,612,500, or so much thereof  
 19 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works  
 20 Fund to the Department of Agriculture for deposit into the  
 21 Partners for Conservation Projects Fund.

4 Section 10. No contract shall be entered into or  
5 obligation incurred for any expenditures from appropriations

10 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

11 Section 5. The sum of \$3,000,000, or so much thereof as  
12 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Port Development  
13 Revolving Loan Fund to the Department of Commerce and  
14 Economic Opportunity for grants and loans associated with the  
15 Port Development Revolving Loan Program pursuant to 30 ILCS  
16 750/9-11.

17 Section 10. The sum of \$50,000,000, or so much thereof  
18 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works  
19 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity  
20 for all costs associated with the capital development of coal

1 gasification plants.

2 Section 15. The sum of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof as  
3 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works  
4 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity  
5 for a grant to the Abraham Lincoln Capital Airport to realign  
6 the front entrance road.

7 Section 20. The sum of \$450,000,000, or so much thereof  
8 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works  
9 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity  
10 for grants, loans, and investments or other economic  
11 development activities including, but not limited to,  
12 community public safety programs, job creation and retention  
13 programs, community support and economic development.

14 Section 21. The sum of \$150,000,000, or so much thereof  
15 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works  
16 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity  
17 for grants, loans and investments or other activities  
18 associated with health care development, including but not  
19 limited to community health centers and the Hospital Capital  
20 Investment Program.

21 Section 22. The sum of \$50,000,000, or so much thereof

1 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works  
2 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity  
3 for affordable housing grants, loans, and investments.

4 Section 25. The sum of \$25,000,000, or so much thereof  
5 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works  
6 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity  
7 for all costs associated with investment in next generation  
8 ethanol production using cellulosic, fractionation and other  
9 next generation technologies.

10 Section 30. The sum of \$17,000,000, or so much thereof  
11 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works  
12 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity  
13 for a grant to Fermi National Accelerator Laboratory for the  
14 Illinois Accelerator Research Center.

15 Section 35. The sum of \$13,000,000, or so much thereof  
16 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works  
17 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity  
18 for a grant to Argonne National Laboratory for the Advanced  
19 Protein Crystallization Facility.

20 Section 40. The sum of \$60,000,000, or so much thereof  
21 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works

1 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity  
2 for a grant to University of Illinois at Urbana/Champaign for  
3 all costs associated with design and construction of a  
4 Petascale Computing Facility.

5 Section 45. The sum of \$490,000, or so much thereof as  
6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works  
7 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity  
8 for a grant to University of Illinois at Chicago for all  
9 costs associated with planning campus improvements.

10 Section 50. The sum of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof as  
11 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works  
12 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity  
13 for grants associated with adding new E-85 fuel pumps across  
14 the State.

15 Section 55. The sum of \$20,000,000, or so much thereof  
16 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works  
17 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity  
18 for all costs associated with investment in next generation  
19 biodiesel production.

21 Section 56. The sum of \$53,000,000, or so much thereof  
22 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works



1 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity  
2 for a grant to Southern Illinois University for the research  
3 and development of new coal-based energy systems including,  
4 but not limited to, feasibility and design for carbon  
5 management in commercial settings, planning, design, and  
6 construction of an energy and science laboratory, and  
7 engineering and design initiatives for the development and  
8 upgrading of existing electric generating systems.

9 Section 60. The sum of \$300,000,000, or so much thereof  
10 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works  
11 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity  
12 for the making of grants and expenditures for planning,  
13 engineering, acquisition, construction, reconstruction,  
14 development, improvement and extension of public  
15 infrastructure in the State of Illinois, including grants to  
16 local governments for public infrastructure, grants to public  
17 elementary and secondary school districts for public  
18 infrastructure, grants to universities, colleges, community  
19 colleges, and non-profit corporations for public purposes,  
20 including but not limited to expenditures for equipment,  
21 vehicles, community programs, and recreational facilities.

22 Section 65. The sum of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof as  
23 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Works

1 Fund to the Department Of Commerce and Economic Opportunity  
 2 for a grant to the University of Illinois at Urbana/Champaign  
 3 for the Information Trust Institute to procure and develop  
 4 the Center for Pervasive Health Technology.

5 Section 75. The amount of \$25,000,000, or so much  
 6 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the  
 7 Illinois Works Fund to the Department of Commerce and  
 8 Economic Opportunity for grants to local governments for  
 9 capital improvements to civic centers for the projects  
 10 hereinafter enumerated:

 17 obligation incurred or any expenditure made from any

 20 Article until after the purpose and amounts have been  
 21 approved in writing by the Governor.

## 2 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

3 Section 5. The sum of \$319,116, or so much thereof as  
4 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of  
5 business on June 30, 2008, from a reappropriation heretofore  
6 made in Article 475, Section 30 of Public Act 95-348, is  
7 reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the  
8 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for Coal  
9 Development Programs.

10 Section 10. The sum of \$50,000,000, or so much thereof  
11 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of  
12 business on June 30, 2008, from a reappropriation heretofore  
13 made in Article 475, Section 35 of Public Act 95-348, is  
14 reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the  
15 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants  
16 pursuant to 20 ILCS 605/605-332 - Coal Revival Program.

17 Section 15. The sum of \$1,975,000, or so much thereof as  
18 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of  
19 business on June 30, 2008, from a reappropriation heretofore  
20 made in Article 475, Section 70 of Public Act 95-348, is  
21 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the  
22 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants

1 associated with the Illinois Renewable Fuels Development Act.

2 Section 20. The sum of \$13,000,000, or so much thereof  
3 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of  
4 business on June 30, 2008, from a reappropriation heretofore  
5 made in Article 475, Section 75 of Public Act 95-348, is  
6 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the  
7 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant  
8 to the Argonne National Laboratory for the Rare Isotope  
9 Accelerator for bondable infrastructure improvements. This  
10 appropriated amount shall be in addition to any other  
11 appropriated amounts which can be expended for these  
12 purposes.

13 Section 25. The amount of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof  
14 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of  
15 business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation heretofore  
16 made in Article 475, Section 120 of Public Act 95-348, is  
17 reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the  
18 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the  
19 specific purposes of acquisition, development, construction,  
20 reconstruction, improvement, financing, architectural and  
21 technical planning and installation of capital facilities  
22 consisting of buildings, structures, durable equipment, and  
23 land for the purpose of capital development of coal resources

1 within the State.

2 Section 30. The amount of \$17,000,000, or so much  
3 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the  
4 close of business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation  
5 heretofore made in Article 475, Section 125 of Public Act 95-  
6 348, is reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the  
7 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the  
8 specific purposes of acquisition, development, construction,  
9 reconstruction, improvement, financing, architectural and  
10 technical planning and installation of capital facilities  
11 consisting of buildings, structures, durable equipment, and  
12 land for the purpose of capital development of coal resources  
13 within the State, including but not limited to a grant for a  
14 commercial scale project that produces electric power and  
15 hydrogen and demonstrates underground storage of up to 1  
16 million metric tons annually of carbon dioxide.

19 close of business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation

22 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for  
23 grants to local governments for the acquisition, financing,

1 architectural planning, development, alteration,  
2 installation, and construction of capital facilities

5 General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to State agencies  
6 for such purposes.

8 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of  
9 business on June 30, 2008, from an appropriation heretofore

11 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the  
12 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant  
13 to Argonne National Laboratory for the Advanced Protein
