SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

225 ILCS 85/12 from Ch. 111, par. 4132 225 ILCS 120/24 rep.

Amends the Pharmacy Practice Act. Includes registered pharmacy technicians in provisions concerning license and certificate expiration, renewal, and restoration and licensee and registrant military service. Sets forth continuing education requirements for pharmacy technicians. Amends the Wholesale Drug Act to repeal a Section that requires wholesale distributors to submit a bond to the Department. Effective immediately.

AN ACT concerning regulation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 2 represented in the General Assembly: 3

4 Section 5. The Pharmacy Practice Act is amended by changing 5 Section 12 as follows:

(225 ILCS 85/12) (from Ch. 111, par. 4132) 6

(Section scheduled to be repealed on January 1, 2018)

8 Sec. 12. Expiration of license or certificate of 9 registration; renewal; military service. The expiration date and renewal period for each license and certificate of 10 registration issued under this Act shall be set by rule. 11

As a condition for the renewal of a certificate of 12 registration as a pharmacist license, the licensee registrant 13 14 shall provide evidence to the Department of completion of a total of 30 hours of pharmacy continuing education during the 15 24 months preceding the expiration date of the license 16 17 certificate. Such continuing education shall be approved by the Accreditation Council on Pharmacy Education. 18

19 As a condition for the renewal of a certificate of registration as a pharmacy technician, the registrant shall 20 21 provide evidence to the Department of completion of a total of 22 15 hours of pharmacy continuing education during the 24 months preceding the expiration date of the certificate. Such 23

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<u>continuing education shall be approved by the Accreditation</u> Council on Pharmacy Education.

The Department shall establish by rule a means for the 3 verification of completion of the continuing education 4 5 required by this Section. This verification may be accomplished 6 records maintained through audits of by licensees or 7 registrants, by requiring the filing of continuing education 8 certificates with the Department or a qualified organization 9 selected by the Department to maintain such records or by other 10 means established by the Department.

11 Rules developed under this Section may provide for a 12 reasonable biennial fee, not to exceed \$20, to fund the cost of 13 such recordkeeping. The Department shall, by rule, further 14 provide an orderly process for the reinstatement of licenses or 15 certificates which have not been renewed due to the failure to 16 meet the continuing education requirements of this Section. The 17 requirements of continuing education may be waived, in whole or in part, in cases of extreme hardship as defined by rule of the 18 19 Department. Such waivers shall be granted for not more than one 20 of any 3 consecutive renewal periods.

Any pharmacist <u>or pharmacy technician</u> who has permitted his <u>or her</u> license <u>or certificate</u> to expire or who has had his <u>or</u> <u>her</u> license <u>or certificate</u> on inactive status may have his <u>or</u> <u>her</u> license <u>or certificate</u> restored by making application to the Department and filing proof acceptable to the Department of his <u>or her</u> fitness to have his <u>or her</u> license restored, and by

paying the required restoration fee. The Department shall 1 2 determine, by an evaluation program established by rule his or her fitness for restoration of his or her license and shall 3 establish procedures and requirements for such restoration. 4 5 However, any pharmacist who demonstrates that he or she has 6 active continuously maintained practice in another 7 jurisdiction pursuant to a license in good standing, and who 8 has substantially complied with the continuing education 9 requirements of this Section shall not be subject to further 10 evaluation for purposes of this Section.

Any licensee <u>or registrant</u> who shall engage in the practice for which his or her license <u>or certificate</u> was issued while the license <u>or certificate</u> is expired or on inactive status shall be considered to be practicing without a license <u>or</u> <u>certificate</u>, which₇ shall be grounds for discipline under Section 30 of this Act.

17 Any pharmacy operating on an expired license is engaged in the unlawful practice of pharmacy and is subject to discipline 18 under Section 30 of this Act. A pharmacy whose license has been 19 20 expired for one year or more may not have its license restored but must apply for a new license and meet all requirements for 21 22 licensure. Any pharmacy whose license has been expired for less 23 than one year may apply for restoration of its license and shall have its license restored. 24

However, any pharmacist <u>or pharmacy technician</u> whose
license <u>or certificate</u> expired while he <u>or she</u> was (1) in

Federal Service on active duty with the Armed Forces of the 1 2 United States, or the State Militia called into service or training, or (2) in training or education under the supervision 3 4 of the United States preliminary to induction into the military 5 service, may have his or her license or certificate restored 6 without paying any lapsed renewal fees, if within 2 years after honorable termination of such service, training or education he 7 8 or she furnishes the Department with satisfactory evidence to 9 the effect that he or she has been so engaged and that his or 10 her service, training or education has been so terminated.
