1 AN ACT concerning education.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The School Code is amended by adding Section
- 5 2-3.148 as follows:
- 6 (105 ILCS 5/2-3.148 new)
- 7 Sec. 2-3.148. Trans fats ban.
- 8 (a) For the purposes of this Section, "trans fat" means fat
 9 that is considered trans fat by the U.S. Food and Drug
- 10 Administration. "Trans fat" does not include naturally
- 11 <u>occurring trans fat. Food shall be deemed to contain trans fat</u>
- 12 <u>under this Section if the food is labeled as, lists as an</u>
- ingredient, or contains any kind of partially hydrogenated
- 14 <u>vegetable oil, including without limitation vegetable</u>
- shortening or margarine. However, food shall not be deemed to
- 16 <u>contain trans fat under this Section if the food contains less</u>
- than 0.5 grams of trans fat per serving.
- 18 (b) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules for the
- 19 <u>elimination of vegetable oils containing trans fats in foods</u>
- 20 <u>served in public school cafeterias beginning on July 1, 2009</u>
- 21 and for the elimination of all foods containing trans fats from
- 22 public schools beginning on July 1, 2010, which ban shall
- 23 include without limitation all foods sold as part of the school

- breakfast and lunch programs under the School Breakfast and 1
- 2 Lunch Program Act, foods sold in vending machines on school
- grounds, and competitive foods sold during school hours. 3
- Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon 4
- 5 becoming law.
