## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- 10 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this Section and
- 11 Section 8n of this Act, and notwithstanding any other State law
- to the contrary, the Governor may, through June 30, 2007, from
- 13 time to time direct the State Treasurer and Comptroller to
- 14 transfer a specified sum from any fund held by the State
- 15 Treasurer to the General Revenue Fund in order to help defray
- 16 the State's operating costs for the fiscal year. The total
- 17 transfer under this Section from any fund in any fiscal year
- shall not exceed the lesser of (i) 8% of the revenues to be
- 19 deposited into the fund during that fiscal year or (ii) an
- amount that leaves a remaining fund balance of 25% of the July
- 21 1 fund balance of that fiscal year. In fiscal year 2005 only,
- 22 prior to calculating the July 1, 2004 final balances, the

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Governor may calculate and direct the State Treasurer with the Comptroller to transfer additional amounts determined by applying the formula authorized in Public Act 93-839 to the funds balances on July 1, 2003. No transfer may be made from a fund under this Section that would have the effect of reducing the available balance in the fund to an amount less than the amount remaining unexpended and unreserved from the total appropriation from that fund estimated to be expended for that fiscal year. This Section does not apply to any funds that are restricted by federal law to a specific use, to any funds in the Motor Fuel Tax Fund, the Intercity Passenger Rail Fund, the Hospital Provider Fund, the Medicaid Provider Relief Fund, the Teacher Health Insurance Security Fund, the Reviewing Court Alternative Dispute Resolution Fund, the Voters' Guide Fund, the Foreign Language Interpreter Fund, the Lawyers' Assistance Program Fund, the Supreme Court Federal Projects Fund, the Supreme Court Special State Projects Fund, the Supplemental Low-Income Energy Assistance Fund, the Good Samaritan Energy Trust Fund, the Low-Level Radioactive Waste Facility Development and Operation Fund, the Horse Racing Equity Trust Fund, the Metabolic Screening and Treatment Fund, or the Hospital Basic Services Preservation Fund, or to any funds to which Section 70-50 of the Nurse Practice Act applies. No transfers may be made under this Section from the Pet Population Control Fund. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Section, for fiscal year 2004, the total transfer under 3

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this Section from the Road Fund or the State Construction 1

2 Account Fund shall not exceed the lesser of (i) 5% of the

revenues to be deposited into the fund during that fiscal year

or (ii) 25% of the beginning balance in the fund. For fiscal

5 year 2005 through fiscal year 2007, no amounts may be

transferred under this Section from the Road Fund, the State

Construction Account Fund, the Criminal Justice Information

Systems Trust Fund, the Wireless Service Emergency Fund, or the

Mandatory Arbitration Fund.

In determining the available balance in a fund, Governor may include receipts, transfers into the fund, and other resources anticipated to be available in the fund in that fiscal year.

The State Treasurer and Comptroller shall transfer the amounts designated under this Section as soon as may be practicable after receiving the direction to transfer from the Governor.

(a-5) Transfers directed to be made under this Section on or before February 28, 2006 that are still pending on May 19, 2006 (the effective date of Public Act 94-774) shall be redirected as provided in Section 8n of this Act.

(b) This Section does not apply to: (i) the Ticket For The Cure Fund; (ii) any fund established under the Community Senior Services and Resources Act; or (iii) on or after January 1, 2006 (the effective date of Public Act 94-511), the Child Labor and Day and Temporary Labor Enforcement Fund.

- (c) This Section does not apply to the Demutualization 1
- 2 Trust Fund established under the Uniform Disposition of

- 22 Budget Transfer Fund.
- 23 (j) This Section does not apply to, and no transfer may be
- made under this Section from, the Soil and Water Conservation 24

- Section 10. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by adding 9
- 10 Section 3-684 as follows:
- 11 (625 ILCS 5/3-684 new)
- 12 Sec. 3-684. Soil and Water Conservation District Plates.
- (a) In addition to any other special license plate, the 13
- 14 Secretary, upon receipt of all applicable fees and applications
- 15 made in the form prescribed by the Secretary of State, may
- issue Soil and Water Conservation District license plates. The 16
- 17 special Soil and Water Conservation District plate issued under
- this Section shall be affixed only to passenger vehicles of the 18
- first division and motor vehicles of the second division 19
- 20 weighing not more than 8,000 pounds. Plates issued under this
- 21 Section shall expire according to the staggered multi-year
- 22 procedure established by Section 3-414.1 of this Code.
- 23 (b) The design, color, and format of the plates shall be
- wholly within the discretion of the Secretary of State. 24

- Appropriate documentation, as determined by the Secretary, 1
- 2 must accompany each application. The Secretary, in his or her
- 3 discretion, shall approve and prescribe stickers or decals as
- 4 provided under Section 3-412.
- 5 (c) An applicant for the special plate shall be charged a
- \$40 fee for original issuance in addition to the appropriate 6
- 7 registration fee. Of this fee, \$25 shall be deposited into the
- 8 Soil and Water Conservation District Fund and \$15 shall be
- 9 deposited into the Secretary of State Special License Plate
- 10 Fund, to be used by the Secretary to help defray the
- 11 administrative processing costs. For each registration renewal
- 12 period, a \$27 fee, in addition to the appropriate registration
- fee, shall be charged. Of this fee, \$25 shall be deposited into 13
- 14 the Soil and Water Conservation District Fund and \$2 shall be
- deposited into the Secretary of State Special License Plate 15
- 16 Fund.
- 17 (d) The Soil and Water Conservation District Fund is
- created as a special fund in the State treasury. All money in 18
- 19 the Soil and Water Conservation District Fund shall be paid,
- 20 subject to appropriation by the General Assembly and approval
- by the Secretary, as grants to Illinois soil and water 21
- 22 conservation districts for projects that conserve and restore
- 23 soil and water in Illinois.
