### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

35 ILCS 5/218 new

Amends the Illinois Income Tax Act. Provides that for taxable years ending on or after December 31, 2009, each taxpayer who was a volunteer emergency medical worker during the entire taxable year is entitled to an income tax credit. Provides that the credit may not exceed \$500 or the amount of the taxpayer's liability under this Act, whichever is less. Prohibits the carry forward of an excess tax credit to a succeeding year's tax liability. Exempts the provisions from the sunset requirements. Effective July 1, 2009.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Income Tax Act is amended by adding
Section 218 as follows:

7 Sec. 218. Tax credit for volunteer emergency medical 8 workers. 9 (a) For taxable years ending on or after December 31, 2009, each taxpayer who was a volunteer emergency medical worker 10 during the entire taxable year is entitled to a credit against 11 the tax imposed by subsections (a) and (b) of Section 201. The 12 credit allowed under this Section may not exceed \$500 or the 13 14 amount of the taxpayer's liability under this Act, whichever is 15 less.

16 <u>(b) If the amount of the credit exceeds the taxpayer's</u> 17 <u>liability under this Act for the year, then the excess may not</u> 18 <u>be carried forward to apply to the taxpayer's liability for the</u> 19 <u>succeeding year.</u>

(c) For the purposes of this Section, "volunteer emergency
 medical worker" means a person who does not receive monetary
 compensation for his or her services as a volunteer Emergency
 Medical Technician (licensed as an EMT-B, EMT-I, or EMT-P under

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1	the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Systems Act), a volunteer
2	ambulance driver or attendant, or a volunteer "First
3	Responder", as defined in Section 3.60 of the Emergency Medical
4	Services (EMT) Systems Act, to a fire department, fire
5	protection district, or other governmental entity and who does
6	not work in one of these capacities for any other fire
7	department, fire protection district, or governmental entity
8	for monetary compensation.
9	(d) This Section is exempt from the provisions of Section
10	<u>250.</u>

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1, 2009.
