SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

10 ILCS 5/4-14.1 from Ch. 46, par. 4-14.1 10 ILCS 5/5-9.1 from Ch. 46, par. 5-9.1 10 ILCS 5/6-55 from Ch. 46, par. 6-55

Amends the Election Code. Authorizes election authorities to use newspaper obituaries, if confirmed as accurate, to purge voter registration records.

1 AN ACT concerning elections.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Election Code is amended by changing Sections 4-14.1, 5-9.1, and 6-55 as follows:
- 6 (10 ILCS 5/4-14.1) (from Ch. 46, par. 4-14.1)
- Sec. 4-14.1. It is the duty of the county clerk to examine,
- 8 monthly, the records deposited in his office pursuant to the
- 9 Vital Records Act that relate to deaths in the county, and to
- 10 cancel the registration of any person so discovered to have who
- 11 has died during the preceding month.
- 12 <u>In addition, the election authority may examine obituaries</u>
- in a newspaper having general circulation throughout a
- 14 <u>municipality or county where the decedents named in the</u>
- obituaries lived immediately prior to death. The election
- authority may cancel the registration of such a decedent after
- 17 <u>the authenticity and accuracy of the obituary have been</u>
- 18 <u>confirmed to the election authority in writing by a funeral</u>
- 19 <u>director of the funeral home or other location where the</u>
- 20 <u>memorial service</u>, wake, funeral, or similar service for the
- 21 <u>decedent was held.</u>

- Sec. 5-9.1. It is the duty of the county clerk to examine
- 3 monthly the records deposited in his office pursuant to the
- 4 Vital Records Act that relate to deaths in the county and, to
- 5 cancel the registration of any person so discovered to have who
- 6 $\frac{\text{has}}{\text{month}}$ died during the preceding month.
- 7 In addition, the election authority may examine obituaries

- 23 Sec. 6-55. The board of election commissioners shall obtain
- 24 the reports provided for by sections 6-61 and 6-62 of this
- 25 Article and shall cancel the registration of criminals and of

deceased persons whose names are <u>so</u> reported to it.

2 In addition, the board of election commissioners may examine obituaries in a newspaper having general circulation 3 4 throughout a municipality or county where the decedents named 5 in the obituaries lived immediately prior to death. The board 6 of election commissioners may cancel the registration of such a decedent after the authenticity and accuracy of the obituary 7 have been confirmed to the board of election commissioners in 8 9 writing by a funeral director of the funeral home or other 10 location where the memorial service, wake, funeral, or similar 11 service for the decedent was held.
