2	AMENDMENT NO Amend House Bill 3005 by replacing
3	everything after the enacting clause with the following:
4	"Section 5. The State Property Control Act is amended by

7	Sec. 7.3. The Administrator shall have charge of all
8	transferable property and shall have authority to take
9	possession and control of such property in order to transfer or
10	assign any such property to any other State agency that has
11	need or use for such property or to dispose of said property in
12	accordance with Section 7 of this Act.
13	Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary,
14	each airplane and helicopter owned by the State and not
15	designated for emergency use under a plan developed pursuant to

Section 3.120 of the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Systems

Act is deemed surplus and shall be sold by the Administrator as soon as possible after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 96th General Assembly, using whatever method of sale, including but not limited to a widely used global Internet auction site, that the Administrator in his or her discretion determines most profitable to the State. Each airplane and helicopter owned by the State and designated for emergency use under a plan developed pursuant to Section 3.120 of the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Systems Act shall be deemed surplus property and sold by the Administrator as soon as possible after the airplane or helicopter ceases to be so designated, using whatever method of sale, including but not limited to a widely used global Internet auction site, that the Administrator in his or her discretion determines most profitable to the State. Proceeds from the sale of each airplane or helicopter shall be deposited into the State Parks Fund and used for State park improvements.

The Administrator may not dispose of a transferable airplane by sale until he or she determines that (i) the agency no longer has a need for the airplane, (ii) the airplane will not be used as a trade-in on another aircraft, and (iii) public university or college in Illinois that offers courses aviation, flight training, or other subjects involving knowledge of the workings of an airplane has listed the for an airplane as provided in this Section.

Responsible officers shall periodically report all of these reviews as necessary.

1 transferable property at locations under their jurisdictions to the Administrator. The Administrator shall review such 2 3 reports and arrange for physical examination of said property 4 if necessary to determine if said items of transferable 5 property should be transferred to another State agency, transferred to a central warehouse, or disposed of. The 6 Administrator shall advise responsible officers of the results 7

The staff under the jurisdiction of the Administrator shall review as necessary State agencies' inventories for potential items of transferable property. If in the opinion of the Administrator's staff, any property appears to be transferable, the Administrator shall notify the responsible officer of his determination. The executive head of the agency holding the property in question may appeal the determination in writing to the Administrator.

Administrator will review the determination accordance with rules and procedures established pursuant to Section 5 of this Act.

The Administrator shall maintain lists of transferable property and of State agency needs for such property and will transfer where appropriate listed transferable property to agencies listing their needs for such property as detailed by their responsible officers. The Administrator must give priority for transfer of an airplane, that is not to be used as a trade in, to a public university or college in Illinois that

- offers courses in aviation, flight training, or other subjects 1
- involving knowledge of the workings of an airplane and that has 2
- 3 listed the need for an airplane.
