SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

25 ILCS 170/11.3 new

Amends the Lobbyist Registration Act. Prohibits a person subject to the Act from accepting compensation from a State agency or community college for lobbying executive, legislative, or administrative action. Exempts the salaries of full-time State or community college employees with responsibilities or authority other than lobbying. Effective immediately.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Lobbyist Registration Act is amended by 5 adding Section 11.3 as follows:

(25 ILCS 170/11.3 new)

Sec. 11.3. Compensation from a State agency or community
college. It is a violation of this Act for a person registered
or required to be registered under this Act to accept or agree
to accept compensation from a State agency or community college
for the purpose of lobbying executive, legislative, or
administrative action.

13 <u>This Section does not apply to compensation that is a</u> 14 <u>portion of the salary of a full-time employee of a State agency</u> 15 <u>or community college whose responsibility or authority</u> 16 <u>includes, but is not limited to, lobbying executive,</u> 17 <u>legislative, or administrative action.</u>

An agreement entered into by a State agency or community college to pay compensation to a person subject to this Section is void. An employee of a State agency or community college who pays or agrees to pay compensation to a person subject to this Section forfeits his or her employment.
