SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

625 ILCS 5/12-610.2

Amends the Illinois Vehicle Code. Provides that a person may not operate a motor vehicle on a roadway while using an electronic communication device (rather than only prohibiting the composing, sending, or reading of electronic messages while operating a vehicle) unless the electronic communication device is used in hands-free or voice-activated mode or one of 5 other limited exceptions apply. Effective January 1, 2011.

AN ACT concerning transportation. 1

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 2 represented in the General Assembly: 3

- Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by changing 4 Section 12-610.2 as follows: 5
- (625 ILCS 5/12-610.2) 6
- 7 Sec. 12-610.2. Electronic communication devices.
- (a) As used in this Section: 8
- "Electronic communication device" means an electronic 9 device, including but not limited to a wireless telephone, 10 personal digital assistant, or a portable or mobile computer 11 while being used for the purpose of composing, reading, or 12 sending an electronic message, but does not include a global 13 14 positioning system or navigation system or a device that is physically or electronically integrated into the motor 15 16 vehicle.
 - "Electronic message" means a self contained piece digital communication that is designed or intended transmitted between physical devices. "Electronic message" includes, but is not limited to electronic mail, a text message, an instant message, or a command or request to access an Internet site.

- while using an electronic communication device to compose,

 send, or read an electronic message.
 - (c) A violation of this Section is an offense against traffic regulations governing the movement of vehicles.
 - (d) This Section does not apply to:
 - (1) a law enforcement officer or operator of an emergency vehicle while performing his or her official duties;
 - (2) a driver using an electronic communication device for the sole purpose of reporting an emergency situation and continued communication with emergency personnel during the emergency situation;
 - (3) a driver using an electronic communication device in hands-free or voice-activated mode; or
 - (4) a driver of a commercial motor vehicle reading a message displayed on a permanently installed communication device designed for a commercial motor vehicle with a screen that does not exceed 10 inches tall by 10 inches wide in size;
 - (5) a driver using an electronic communication device while parked on the shoulder of a roadway; or
 - (6) a driver using an electronic communication device when the vehicle is stopped due to normal traffic being obstructed and the driver has the motor vehicle transmission in neutral or park.
