1 HOUSE RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Francisco O. Chapa has rendered exemplary service to his nation, his family, and his community and is deserving of recognition for his many accomplishments; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Chapa was born in Sinton, Texas on October 10, 1922; he answered his nation's call to duty with service in the United States Army during World War II, during which he participated in the Allied D-Day landings at Normandy and fought under General George Patton at the Battle of the Bulge; he received several commendations for his actions, including the Good Conduct Medal, the World War II Victory Medal, the American Theater Ribbon, the European-African-Middle Eastern Campaign Ribbon with Silver Star Device, and the Purple Heart with one Oak Leaf Cluster; and

WHEREAS, After concluding his military service in 1947, Mr. Chapa returned home; on February 27, 1949, he married his wife, Virginia; the couple raised six children, and, over the years, the family has grown to include numerous grandchildren; Mr. Chapa was a longtime civil service employee at Naval Air Station Corpus Christi in Texas; after retiring from that position, he went to work for Del Mar College in Corpus Christi, Texas; and
