WHEREAS, He graduated from Boston College in 1967 with a degree in Philosophy; he received his Juris Doctor in 1974 from Creighton University Law School in Omaha, Nebraska; he practiced law in Elmhurst and was a Cook County Assistant State's Attorney before marrying Elsie (Campbell) in 1984; he practiced family law in Sandwich for 22 years; and

WHEREAS, In 1994, he ran for Circuit Court Judge for the 16th Judicial Circuit and for De Kalb County State's Attorney in 1996; in 2006, he made a career change to teach Latin at Aurora Central Catholic High School; and
