1 AMENDMENT TO SENATE BILL 1216

2 AMENDMENT NO. \_\_\_\_\_. Amend Senate Bill 1216, by deleting  
3 everything after the enacting clause and inserting the  
4 following:

5 "ARTICLE 1

6 Section 5. "Operational expenses" defined. For the  
7 purposes of this Act, the term "operational expenses"  
8 includes the following items:

- 9 (a) Personal services;
- 10 (b) State contributions to Social Security;
- 11 (c) Group Insurance;
- 12 (d) Contractual Services;
- 13 (e) Travel;
- 14 (f) Commodities;

- 1 (g) Printing;
- 2 (h) Equipment;
- 3 (i) Electronic data processing;
- 4 (j) Telecommunications services;
- 5 (k) Operation of automotive equipment;
- 6 (l) Refunds;
- 7 (m) Employee retirement contributions paid by the employer;
- 8 (n) Permanent improvements;
- 9 (o) Deposits to other funds.

## ARTICLE 2

11 Section 5. The amount of \$13,091,050, or so much thereof  
12 as may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the  
13 President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of  
14 Representatives for furnishing the items provided in Section  
15 4 of the General Assembly Compensation Act to members of  
16 their respective houses throughout the year in connection  
17 with their legislative duties and responsibilities and not in  
18 connection with any political campaign as prescribed by law.  
19 Of this amount, 37.436% is appropriated to the President of  
20 the Senate for such expenditures and 62.564% is appropriated  
21 to the Speaker of the House for such expenditures.

22 Section 10. Payments from the amounts appropriated in

1 Section 5 hereof shall be made only upon the delivery of a  
2 voucher approved by the member to the State Comptroller. The  
3 voucher shall also be approved by the President of the Senate  
4 or the Speaker of the House of Representatives as the case  
5 may be.

6 Section 15. The amount of \$20,603,400 or so much thereof  
7 as may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to meet  
8 the ordinary and incidental expenses of the Senate  
9 legislative leadership and legislative staff assistants and  
10 the House Majority and Minority leadership staff, general  
11 staff and office operations. Of this amount, 25.7% is  
12 appropriated to the President of the Senate for such  
13 expenditures, 25.7% is appropriated to the Senate Minority  
14 Leader for such expenditures and 24.8% is appropriated to the  
15 Speaker of the House for such expenditures, and 23.8% is  
16 appropriated to the House Minority Leader for such  
17 expenditures.

18 Section 20. The amount of \$9,382,100, or so much thereof  
19 as may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the  
20 President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of  
21 Representatives for the ordinary and incidental expenses of  
22 committees, the general staff and operations, per diem  
23 employees, special and standing committees, expenses incurred

1 in transcribing and printing of debates. Of this amount,  
2 43.018% is appropriated to the President of the Senate for  
3 such expenditures and 56.982% is appropriated to the Speaker  
4 of the House for such expenditures.

5 Section 25. The amount of \$309,200, or so much thereof  
6 as may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the  
7 President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of  
8 Representatives for the ordinary and incidental expenses,  
9 also including the purchasing on contract as required by law  
10 of printing, binding, printing paper, stationery and office  
11 supplies. For the House, no part of which shall be expended  
12 for expenses of purchasing, handling or distributing such  
13 supplies and against which no indebtedness shall be incurred  
14 without the written approval of the Speaker of the House of  
15 Representatives. Of this amount, 69.277% is appropriated to  
16 the President of the Senate for such expenditures and 30.723%  
17 is appropriated to the Speaker of the House for such  
18 expenditures.

19 Section 30. The amount of \$4,483,050, or so much thereof  
20 as may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the  
21 President of the Senate for the use of standing committees  
22 for expert witnesses, technical services, consulting  
23 assistance and other research assistance associated with

1 special studies and long range research projects which may be  
2 requested by the standing committees and the Speaker of the  
3 House of Representatives for Standing House Committees  
4 pursuant to the Legislative Commission Reorganization Act of  
5 1984. Of this amount, 46.862% is appropriated to the  
6 President of the Senate for such expenditures and 53.138% is  
7 appropriated to the Speaker of the House for such  
8 expenditures.

9 Section 35. The amount of \$167,000, or so much thereof  
10 as may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the  
11 President of the Senate and the Senate Minority Leader for  
12 allowances for the particular and additional services  
13 appertaining to or entailed by the respective officers of the  
14 Senate. Of this amount, 50% is appropriated to the President  
15 of the Senate for such expenditures and 50% is appropriated  
16 to the Senate Minority Leader for such expenditures.

17 Section 40. The amount of \$88,100, or so much thereof as  
18 may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the  
19 President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of  
20 Representatives for travel, including expenses to Springfield  
21 of members on official legislative business during weeks when  
22 the General Assembly is not in session. Of this amount,  
23 65.5% is appropriated to the President of the Senate for such

1 expenditures and 34.5% is appropriated to the Speaker of the  
2 House for such expenditures.

3 Section 45. The amount of \$441,600, or so much thereof  
4 as may be necessary and remains unexpended from an  
5 appropriation heretofore made for such purposes in Article 17  
6 of Public Act 95-0731, is appropriated to the Speaker of the  
7 House for expenses in connection with the planning and  
8 preparation of redistricting of legislative and  
9 representative districts as required by Article IV, Section 3  
10 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970.

11 Section 50. The amount of \$341,600, or so much thereof  
12 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue  
13 Fund to the General Assembly to meet ordinary and contingent  
14 expenses. Any use of funds appropriated under this Section  
15 must be approved jointly by the Clerk of the House of  
16 Representatives and the Secretary of the Senate.

17 Section 55. As used in Section 15 hereof, except where  
18 the approval of the Speaker of the House of Representatives  
19 is expressly required for the expenditure of or the  
20 incurring of indebtedness against an appropriation for  
21 certain purchases on contract, "Speaker" means the leader of  
22 the party having the largest number of members of the House

1 of Representatives as of January 14, 2009, and "Minority  
 2 Leader" means the leader of the party having the second  
 3 largest number of members of the House of Representatives as  
 4 of January 14, 2009.

5 Section 60. The sum of \$312,455, or so much thereof as  
 6 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Legislative Ethics  
 7 Commission to meet the ordinary and contingent expenses of  
 8 the Commission and the Office of Legislative Inspector  
 9 General.

10 Section 65. The sum of \$113,700, or so much thereof as  
 11 may be necessary, is appropriated for the ordinary and  
 12 contingent expenses of the Senate Operations Commission  
 13 including the planning costs, construction costs, moving  
 14 expenses and all other costs associated with the construction  
 15 and reconstruction of Senate offices in the Capitol Complex  
 16 area.

17 Section 70. The following named sums, or so much thereof  
 18 as may be necessary, are appropriated for expenses in  
 19 connection with the planning and preparation of redistricting  
 20 of legislative and representative districts as required by  
 21 Article IV, Section 3 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970:

22 For the Senate President .....250,000

1 For the Senate Minority Leader .....250,000  
 2 Total \$500,000

3 Section 75. The following named sums, or so much thereof  
 4 as may be necessary, are appropriated for expenses in  
 5 connection with the planning and preparation of redistricting

 7 Article IV, Section 3 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970:
