

## 96TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2009 and 2010 SB1299

Introduced 2/10/2009, by Sen. Ira I. Silverstein

## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Amends the Illinois Vehicle Code. Creates the offenses of driving with a screen device operating, a Class 1, 3, or 4 felony or a Class A misdemeanor depending on specified circumstances, and unlawful installation of television, monitor, or similar device, a Class A misdemeanor. Provides that a person commits the offense of driving with a screen device operating when the person is driving a motor vehicle that has a television, video monitor, portable computer, or any other similar means operating that is capable of providing a visual display in full view of a driver in a normal driving position while the motor vehicle is in motion. Provides that a person commits the offense of unlawful installation of television, monitor, or similar device if the person installs or alters a television, video monitor, portable computer, or any other similar means capable of providing a visual display that is in full view of a driver of a motor vehicle in a normal driving position while the motor vehicle is in motion. Provides several exceptions and an affirmative defense. Renames a "cellular radio telecommunication device" as a "mobile communication device", and modifies the definitions of a "mobile communication device" and "using a mobile communication device" to prohibit text messaging and other similar uses of mobile communication devices (instead of prohibiting just talking, listening to, and dialing telephonic communications) for purposes of expanding a provision prohibiting the use of mobile communication devices by school bus drivers. Repeals a provision relating to the use of video devices while driving. Effective immediately.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by changing Section 12-813.1 and by adding Section 12-604.2 as follows:
- 6 (625 ILCS 5/12-604.2 new)
- 7 Sec. 12-604.2. Driving with a screen device operating;
- 8 unlawful installation of television, monitor, or similar
- 9 <u>device.</u>
- 10 <u>(a) A person commits the offense of driving with a screen</u>
  11 device operating if:
- 12 (1) the person is driving a motor vehicle;
- 13 (2) the motor vehicle has a television, video monitor,

  14 portable computer, or any other similar means capable of

  15 providing a visual display that is in full view of a driver

  16 in a normal driving position while the motor vehicle is in
- 17 <u>motion; and</u>
- 18 (3) the monitor or visual display is operating while
  19 the person is driving.
- 20 (b) A person commits the offense of unlawful installation 21 of television, monitor, or similar device if the person 22 installs or alters equipment described in subdivision (a) (2) of 23 this Section that allows the images to be viewed by the driver

| 13 | (f) A person who violates subsection (a) of this Section is     |

| 24 | (g) A person who violates subsection (b) of this Section is     |

- Sec. 12-813.1. Operation of a school bus while using a
- 3 <u>mobile communication</u> <del>cellular radio telecommunication</del> device.
- 4 (a) In this Section:
- 5 "School bus driver" means a person operating a school bus
- 6 who has a valid school bus driver permit as required under
- 7 Sections 6-104 and 6-106.1 of this Code.
- 8 "Mobile communication Cellular radio telecommunication
- 9 device" means a two or more way communication device capable of
- 10 sending or receiving telephone communications without an
- 11 access line for service and which requires the operator to
- 12 <u>enter numbers or letters</u> dial numbers manually, and is used for
- 13 radio-telephone communications used in wireless telephone
- 14 service, personal communication service, or the functional
- 15 equivalent of a radio-telephone communications line used in
- 16 wireless telephone service or a personal communication
- 17 service. It does not, however, include citizens band radios or
- 18 citizens band radio hybrids.
- 19 "Using a <u>mobile communication</u> <del>cellular radio</del>
- 20 telecommunication device" means talking, or listening to, or
- 21 <u>typing on, or dialing a mobile communication</u> <del>cellular radio</del>
- 22 telecommunication device.
- To "operate" means to have the vehicle in motion while it
- contains one or more passengers.
- 25 (b) A school bus driver may not operate a school bus while
- 26 using a mobile communication <del>cellular radio telecommunication</del>

and not more than \$250.

| 25 | of a petty offense punishable by a fine of not less than \$100            |
