SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Appropriates \$500,000 to the Department of Public Health to provide families of ALS patients that are in need with outreach services and support. Effective July 1, 2009.

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AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 WHEREAS, Approximately 1,000 people in Illinois have 3 amyotrophic lateral sclerosis, also known as ALS or Lou 4 Gehrig's disease; and

5 WHEREAS, About 250 more are diagnosed each year, but 6 thousands more are actually affected by the disease, as 7 friends and family members become caregivers for people with 8 ALS; and

9 WHEREAS, Working closely with both Northwestern 10 University Feinberg School of Medicine, the Northwestern 11 Medical Faculty Foundation, and Northwestern Memorial 12 Hospital, the Les Turner ALS Foundation currently serves 13 almost 400 patients throughout the Chicagoland area;

14 WHEREAS, This number is approximately 80% of the ALS 15 population in the Chicagoland areas; and

16 WHEREAS, Although the Les Turner ALS Foundation is able 17 to provide grants to families for equipment and care, as well 18 as home visits, this is only a fraction of the actual costs 19 incurred by families caring for a loved one with ALS; and 1 WHEREAS, Because the State of Illinois, federal government, and private health insurers provide limited 2 funding for these services, the Les Turner ALS Foundation, 3 and similar organizations have taken on the responsibility of 4 ensuring a quality life for patients with ALS and their 5 families; therefore 6

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

9 Section 5. The amount of \$500,000, or so much of that 10 amount as may be necessary is appropriated from the General 11 Revenue Fund to the Department of Public Health for a grant 12 to provide families of ALS patients that are in need with 13 outreach services and support.

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1,2009.
