# 96TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2009 and 2010 SB1876

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:
35 ILCS 5/250

Amends the Illinois Income Tax Act. Makes a technical change in a Section concerning the sunset of exemptions, credits, and deductions.

AN ACT concerning revenue.

# Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly: 

Section 5. The Illinois Income Tax Act is amended by changing Section 250 as follows:
(35 ILCS 5/250)
Sec. 250. Sunset of exemptions, credits, and deductions. The the application of every exemption, credit, and deduction against tax imposed by this Act that becomes law after the effective date of this amendatory Act of 1994 shall be limited by a reasonable and appropriate sunset date. A taxpayer is not entitled to take the exemption, credit, or deduction for tax years beginning on or after the sunset date. If a reasonable and appropriate sunset date is not specified in the Public Act that creates the exemption, credit, or deduction, a taxpayer shall not be entitled to take the exemption, credit, or deduction for tax years beginning on or after 5 years after the effective date of the Public Act creating the exemption, credit, or deduction and thereafter; provided, however, that in the case of any Public Act authorizing the issuance of tax-exempt obligations that does not specify a sunset date for the exemption or deduction of income derived from the obligations, the exemption or deduction shall not terminate
