Multifunction school activity bus. A 9 10 multifunction school-activity bus (MFSAB) means a school bus 11 manufactured for the purpose of transporting 11 to 15 persons, 12 including the driver, purposes whose do not include 13 transporting students to and from home or school bus stops. However, non-public schools may use a multifunction school 14

However, 13 non-public schools may use a multifunction school activity bus, 14 as defined in Section 1-148.3a-5 of this Code, to transport non-public school students between non-public schools for 15 curriculum-related school activity. 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25 (b) Every student enrolled in grade 12 or below in any

1 entity listed in subsection (a) of Section 1-182 of this Code 2 who is transported in a vehicle that is being operated by or 3 for a public or private primary or secondary school, including 4 any primary or secondary school operated by a religious 5 institution, for an interscholastic, interscholastic-athletic, 6 or school-sponsored, noncurriculum-related activity that (i) does not require student participation as part of 7 educational services of the entity and (ii) is not associated 8 9 with the students' regular class-for-credit schedule shall 10 transport students only in a school bus or vehicle described in subsection (b) of Section 1-182 of this Code. This subsection 11 (b) does not apply to any second division vehicle used by an 12 13 entity listed in subsection (a) of Section 1-182 of this Code for a parade, homecoming, or a similar noncurriculum-related 14 15 school activity.
