1 AMENDMENT TO SENATE BILL 3222

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend Senate Bill 3222 by replacing
3 everything after the enacting clause with the following:

4 "Section 5. The University of Illinois Act is amended by
5 changing Section 25 as follows:

6 (110 ILCS 305/25)

7 Sec. 25. Limitation on tuition increase. This Section
8 applies only to those students who first enroll after the
9 2003-2004 academic year. For 5 4 continuous academic years
10 following initial enrollment or up to 120 credit hours
11 following initial enrollment, whichever is earlier (or for
12 undergraduate programs that require more than 5 4 years or 120
13 credit hours to complete, for the normal time to complete the
14 program, as determined by the University), the tuition charged
15 an undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident shall not
16 exceed the amount that the student was charged at the time he

1 or she first enrolled in the University. However, if the
2 student changes majors during this time period, the tuition
3 charged the student shall equal the amount the student would
4 have been charged had he or she been admitted to the changed
5 major when he or she first enrolled.

7 Section 10. The Southern Illinois University Management
8 Act is amended by changing Section 15 as follows:

9 (110 ILCS 520/15)

10 Sec. 15. Limitation on tuition increase. This Section
11 applies only to those students who first enroll after the
12 2003-2004 academic year. For 5 ~~4~~ continuous academic years
13 following initial enrollment or up to 120 credit hours
14 following initial enrollment, whichever is earlier (or for
15 undergraduate programs that require more than 5 ~~4~~ years or 120
16 credit hours to complete, for the normal time to complete the
17 program, as determined by the University), the tuition charged
18 an undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident shall not
19 exceed the amount that the student was charged at the time he
20 or she first enrolled in the University. However, if the
21 student changes majors during this time period, the tuition
22 charged the student shall equal the amount the student would
23 have been charged had he or she been admitted to the changed
24 major when he or she first enrolled.

2 Section 15. The Chicago State University Law is amended by
3 changing Section 5-120 as follows:

4 (110 ILCS 660/5-120)

5 Sec. 5-120. Limitation on tuition increase. This Section
6 applies only to those students who first enroll after the
7 2003-2004 academic year. For 5 4 continuous academic years
8 following initial enrollment or up to 120 credit hours
9 following initial enrollment, whichever is earlier (or for
10 undergraduate programs that require more than 5 4 years or 120
11 credit hours to complete, for the normal time to complete the
12 program, as determined by the University), the tuition charged
13 an undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident shall not
14 exceed the amount that the student was charged at the time he
15 or she first enrolled in the University. However, if the
16 student changes majors during this time period, the tuition
17 charged the student shall equal the amount the student would
18 have been charged had he or she been admitted to the changed
19 major when he or she first enrolled.

21 Section 20. The Eastern Illinois University Law is amended
22 by changing Section 10-120 as follows:

1 (110 ILCS 665/10-120)

2 Sec. 10-120. Limitation on tuition increase. This Section
3 applies only to those students who first enroll after the
4 2003-2004 academic year. For 5 4 continuous academic years
5 following initial enrollment or up to 120 credit hours
6 following initial enrollment, whichever is earlier (or for
7 undergraduate programs that require more than 5 4 years or 120
8 credit hours to complete, for the normal time to complete the
9 program, as determined by the University), the tuition charged
10 an undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident shall not
11 exceed the amount that the student was charged at the time he
12 or she first enrolled in the University. However, if the
13 student changes majors during this time period, the tuition
14 charged the student shall equal the amount the student would
15 have been charged had he or she been admitted to the changed
16 major when he or she first enrolled.

18 Section 25. The Governors State University Law is amended
19 by changing Section 15-120 as follows:

20 (110 ILCS 670/15-120)

21 Sec. 15-120. Limitation on tuition increase. This Section
22 applies only to those students who first enroll after the
23 2003-2004 academic year. For 5 4 continuous academic years
24 following initial enrollment or up to 120 credit hours

1 following initial enrollment, whichever is earlier (or for
2 undergraduate programs that require more than 5 4 years or 120
3 credit hours to complete, for the normal time to complete the
4 program, as determined by the University), the tuition charged
5 an undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident shall not
6 exceed the amount that the student was charged at the time he
7 or she first enrolled in the University. However, if the
8 student changes majors during this time period, the tuition
9 charged the student shall equal the amount the student would
10 have been charged had he or she been admitted to the changed
11 major when he or she first enrolled.

13 Section 30. The Illinois State University Law is amended by
14 changing Section 20-125 as follows:

15 (110 ILCS 675/20-125)

16 Sec. 20-125. Limitation on tuition increase. This Section
17 applies only to those students who first enroll after the
18 2003-2004 academic year. For 5 4 continuous academic years
19 following initial enrollment or up to 120 credit hours
20 following initial enrollment, whichever is earlier (or for
21 undergraduate programs that require more than 5 4 years or 120
22 credit hours to complete, for the normal time to complete the
23 program, as determined by the University), the tuition charged
24 an undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident shall not

1 exceed the amount that the student was charged at the time he
2 or she first enrolled in the University. However, if the
3 student changes majors during this time period, the tuition
4 charged the student shall equal the amount the student would
5 have been charged had he or she been admitted to the changed
6 major when he or she first enrolled.

8 Section 35. The Northeastern Illinois University Law is
9 amended by changing Section 25-120 as follows:

10 (110 ILCS 680/25-120)

11 Sec. 25-120. Limitation on tuition increase. This Section
12 applies only to those students who first enroll after the
13 2003-2004 academic year. For 5 + continuous academic years
14 following initial enrollment or up to 120 credit hours
15 following initial enrollment, whichever is earlier (or for
16 undergraduate programs that require more than 5 + years or 120
17 credit hours to complete, for the normal time to complete the
18 program, as determined by the University), the tuition charged
19 an undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident shall not
20 exceed the amount that the student was charged at the time he
21 or she first enrolled in the University. However, if the
22 student changes majors during this time period, the tuition
23 charged the student shall equal the amount the student would
24 have been charged had he or she been admitted to the changed

1 major when he or she first enrolled.

3 Section 40. The Northern Illinois University Law is amended
4 by changing Section 30-130 as follows:

5 (110 ILCS 685/30-130)

6 Sec. 30-130. Limitation on tuition increase. This Section
7 applies only to those students who first enroll after the
8 2003-2004 academic year. For 5 4 continuous academic years
9 following initial enrollment or up to 120 credit hours
10 following initial enrollment, whichever is earlier (or for
11 undergraduate programs that require more than 5 4 years or 120
12 credit hours to complete, for the normal time to complete the
13 program, as determined by the University), the tuition charged
14 an undergraduate student who is an Illinois resident shall not
15 exceed the amount that the student was charged at the time he
16 or she first enrolled in the University. However, if the
17 student changes majors during this time period, the tuition
18 charged the student shall equal the amount the student would
19 have been charged had he or she been admitted to the changed
20 major when he or she first enrolled.

22 Section 45. The Western Illinois University Law is amended
23 by changing Section 35-125 as follows:

1 (110 ILCS 690/35-125)

2 Sec. 35-125. Limitation on tuition increase. This Section
3 applies only to those students who first enroll after the
4 2003-2004 academic year. The tuition charged an undergraduate
5 student who is an Illinois resident shall not exceed the amount
6 that the student was charged at the time he or she first
7 enrolled at the University as an Illinois resident if that
8 student first enrolled not more than 4 3 and one-half academic
9 years before or if that student has not earned more than 120
10 credit hours following initial enrollment, whichever is
11 earlier. However, if the student changes majors during this
12 time period, the tuition charged the student shall equal the
13 amount the student would have been charged had he or she been
14 admitted to the changed major when he or she first enrolled.
