SB3635 Engrossed

1 AN ACT concerning education.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
14C-12 as follows:

6 (105 ILCS 5/14C-12) (from Ch. 122, par. 14C-12)

7 14C-12. Account of expenditures; Cost Sec. report; 8 Reimbursement. Each school district shall keep an accurate, 9 detailed and separate account of all monies paid out by it for the programs in transitional bilingual education required or 10 permitted by this Article, including transportation costs, and 11 shall annually report thereon for the school year ending June 12 13 30 indicating the average per pupil expenditure. Each school 14 district shall be reimbursed for the amount by which such costs exceed the average per pupil expenditure by such school 15 16 district for the education of children of comparable age who 17 are not in any special education program. At least 60% of bilingual funding must be used for instructional costs. 18

Applications for preapproval for reimbursement for costs of transitional bilingual education programs must be submitted to the State Superintendent of Education at least 60 days before a transitional bilingual education program is started, unless a justifiable exception is granted by the State SB3635 Engrossed - 2 - LRB096 20719 MJR 36451 b

Superintendent of Education. Applications shall set forth a
 plan for transitional bilingual education established and
 maintained in accordance with this Article.

4 Reimbursement claims for transitional bilingual education
5 programs shall be made as follows:

Each school district shall claim reimbursement on a current 6 7 basis for the first 3 quarters of the fiscal year and file a 8 final adjusted claim for the school year ended June 30 9 preceding computed in accordance with rules prescribed by the State Superintendent's Office. The State Superintendent of 10 11 Education before approving any such claims shall determine 12 their accuracy and whether they are based upon services and 13 facilities provided under approved programs. Upon approval he 14 shall transmit to the Comptroller the vouchers showing the 15 amounts due for school district reimbursement claims. Upon 16 receipt of the final adjusted claims the State Superintendent 17 of Education shall make a final determination of the accuracy of such claims. If the money appropriated by the General 18 19 Assembly for such purpose for any year is insufficient, it 20 shall be apportioned on the basis of the claims approved.

Failure on the part of the school district to prepare and certify the final adjusted claims due under this Section may constitute a forfeiture by the school district of its right to be reimbursed by the State under this Section.
