State-Operated Developmental Centers (SODCs) are uniquely positioned to provide these services because the high needs of many SODC residents already necessitate the presence of highly trained and specialized staff as part of the

(b) Community Resource Centers. Subject to appropriation, the Department shall be authorized to operate Community Resource Centers at each of its 8 State-Operated Developmental Centers (SODCs). The objective of the Community Resource Centers is to augment services delivered in the community by providing the services of the skilled SODC workforce to individuals residing in community settings when individuals need those services. The services may be provided on an inpatient or outpatient basis, in the resident's home, or in other settings. Services to be provided may include, but need not be limited to, the following:

(1) Direct care services for individuals with developmental disabilities, including, but not limited to, medical services, podiatric services, dental services, respite care, psychiatric services, behavioral services, geriatric services, post-operative convalescent care, crisis medical and behavioral care, communication
