

## 97TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2011 and 2012 HB3387

## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

105 ILCS 5/27-23.9

Amends the School Code. In a Section concerning the School Bullying Prevention Task Force, requires the State Board of Education to convene the Task Force to continue to monitor bullying in schools and to consider any additional recommendations subsequent to the submission of its report to the Governor and the General Assembly, which recommendations must be submitted in a report to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before December 30, 2013. Repeals the Section on December 31, 2013 (instead of March 2, 2011). Effective immediately.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- 4 Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section

- 11 (b) The Task Force is created and charged with exploring
  12 the causes and consequences of bullying in schools in this
  13 State, identifying promising practices that reduce incidences
  14 of bullying, highlighting training and technical assistance
  15 opportunities for schools to effectively address bullying,
  16 evaluating the effectiveness of schools' current anti-bullying
  17 policies and other bullying prevention programs, and other
- 19 (c) Within 60 days after the effective date of this 20 amendatory Act of the 96th General Assembly, the State 21 Superintendent of Education shall appoint 15 members to the 22 Task Force. The membership of the Task Force shall include 23 representatives of State agencies whose work includes bullying

- prevention or intervention; statewide organizations that focus on violence or bullying prevention or intervention; teachers and management personnel from at least 3 school districts; academics who conduct research on bullying, its consequences to students in grades K through 12, or effective strategies for preventing or addressing bullying; a current high school or college student who has experienced bullying; and others at the State Superintendent's discretion. Members of the Task Force shall serve without compensation.
- 10 (d) The State Board of Education shall provide technical
  11 assistance for the work of the Task Force.
  - submit a report to the Governor and the General Assembly on any recommendations for preventing and addressing bullying in schools in this State and a proposed timeline for meeting the Task Force's charges identified in this Section. The State Board of Education shall convene the Task Force to continue to monitor bullying in schools and to consider any additional recommendations subsequent to the submission of the report to the Governor and the General Assembly, which recommendations must be submitted in a report to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before December 30, 2013.
- 23 (f) This Section is repealed on <u>December 31, 2013</u> March 2, 24  $\frac{2011}{2000}$ .
