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AN ACT concerning State government.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the
Illinois Main Street Act.

6 Section 5. Legislative purpose. The General Assembly makes7 the following findings:

8 (1) The continued economic vitality of downtown and 9 neighborhood commercial districts in our municipalities is 10 essential to community preservation, social cohesion, and 11 economic growth.

12 Municipalities need to maintain their local (2) economies so that business owners will be able to provide 13 14 goods and services to the community, to provide employment opportunities, to avoid disinvestment 15 and economic dislocations, and to develop and sustain downtown and 16 17 neighborhood commercial district revitalization programs to address these problems. 18

19 Section 10. Definitions. As used in this Act:

20 "Department" means the Department of Commerce and Economic21 Opportunity.

22 "Director" means the Director of Commerce and Economic

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1 Opportunity.

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"Program" means the Illinois Main Street Program.

3 Section 15. Illinois Main Street Program. The Illinois Main 4 Street Program is created within the Department. In order to 5 implement the Illinois Main Street Program, the Department 6 shall do all of the following:

7 (1) Provide assistance to municipalities designated as 8 Main Street Communities, municipalities interested in 9 becoming designated through the program, and businesses, 10 property owners, organizations, and municipalities 11 undertaking a comprehensive downtown or neighborhood 12 district revitalization initiative commercial and 13 management strategy. Assistance may include, but is not 14 limited to, initial site evaluations and assessments, 15 training for local programs, training for local program 16 staff, site visits and assessments by technical 17 specialists, local program design assistance and 18 evaluation, and continued local program on-site assistance. 19

(2) To the extent funds are made available, provide 20 21 financial assistance to municipalities or local downtown 22 assist in initial organizations to or 23 neighborhood commercial district revitalization program 24 specialized training, specific project feasibility 25 studies, market studies, and design assistance.

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(3) Operate the Illinois Main Street Program in
 accordance with the plan developed by the Department.

3 (4) Consider other factors the Department deems
 4 necessary for the implementation of this Act.

5 Section 20. Main Street Community designation.

(a) The Department shall adopt criteria for the designation
of a Main Street Community. In establishing the criteria, the
Department shall consider all of the following:

9 (1)The degree of interest and commitment. to 10 comprehensive downtown or neighborhood commercial district 11 revitalization and, applicable, where historic 12 preservation by both the public and private sectors.

13 (2) The evidence of potential private sector
14 investment in the downtown or neighborhood commercial
15 district.

16 (3) Where applicable, a downtown or neighborhood
17 commercial district with sufficient historic fabric to
18 become a foundation for an enhanced community image.

19 (4) The capacity of the organization to undertake a 20 comprehensive program and the financial commitment to 21 implement a long-term downtown or neighborhood commercial 22 district revitalization program that includes a commitment 23 to employ a professional program manager.

(5) The National Main Street Center's criteria for
 designating official main street municipalities.

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(6) Other factors the Department deems necessary for
 the designation of a local program.

3 (b) Illinois Main Street shall designate local downtown or 4 neighborhood commercial district revitalization programs and 5 official local main street programs.

6 (c) The Department must approve all local downtown or 7 neighborhood commercial district revitalization program 8 boundaries. The boundaries of a local downtown or neighborhood 9 commercial district revitalization program are typically 10 defined using the pedestrian core of a traditional commercial 11 district.

12 Section 25. Illinois Main Street Plan. The Department 13 shall, in consultation with the Lieutenant Governor, develop a 14 plan for the Illinois Main Street Program. The plan shall 15 describe:

16 (1) the objectives and strategies of the Illinois Main17 Street Program;

18 (2) how the Illinois Main Street Program will be 19 coordinated with existing federal, state, local, and 20 private sector business development and historic 21 preservation efforts;

(3) the means by which private investment will besolicited and employed;

24 (4) the methods of selecting and providing assistance25 to participating local programs; and

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(5) a means to solicit private contributions for State and local operations of the Illinois Main Street Program.

3 Section 30. Role of the Lieutenant Governor. The Lieutenant 4 Governor shall be the Ambassador of the Illinois Main Street 5 Program. The Department shall advise and consult with the 6 Lieutenant Governor on the activities of the Illinois Main 7 Street Program. The Lieutenant Governor, with the assistance of 8 the Department, shall promote and encourage the success of the 9 Illinois Main Street Program.

10 Section 35. Illinois Main Street Fund. The Illinois Main 11 Street Fund is created as a special fund in the State treasury. 12 receipts from private contributions, federal funds, All 13 legislative appropriations, and fees for services, if levied, 14 must be deposited into the Fund. Subject to appropriation, 15 expenditures from the Fund may be used only for the benefit of the Illinois Main Street Program. 16

Section 90. The Green Governments Illinois Act is amendedby changing Sections 15, 35, and 45 as follows:

On and after the effective date of this amendatory 4 Act of the 97th General Assembly, the Governor is the chair of 5 the Council, and the Lieutenant Governor, or his or her 6 designee, shall be a member of the council. The director or 7 8 President, respectively, of each of the following State 9 agencies and State universities, or his or her designee, is a 10 member of the Council: the Department of Commerce and Economic 11 Opportunity, the Environmental Protection Agency, the 12 University of Illinois, the Department of Natural Resources, 13 the Department of Central Management Services, the Governor's 14 Office of Management and Budget, the Department of Agriculture, 15 the Department of Transportation, the Department of 16 Corrections, the Department of Human Services, the Department 17 of Public Health, the State Board of Education, the Board of Higher Education, and the Capital Development Board. The Office 18 19 of the Lieutenant Governor shall provide administrative 20 support to the Council. A minimum of one staff position in the Office of the Lieutenant Governor shall be dedicated to the 21 22 Green Governments Illinois program.

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Sec. 35. Environmental Plans and Reporting.

2 (a) Each State agency shall submit an <u>annual</u> adopted 3 environmental sustainability plan to the chairman of the 4 Council for review and approval on or before April 1, 2008 <u>and</u> 5 <u>each April 1 thereafter</u>.

On or before November 1, 2007, the Council shall prepare a 6 7 downloadable plan template designed to provide a simple 8 framework for the development of an environmental 9 sustainability plan as required by this Act. The Council shall 10 adopt procedures for reviewing and approving the plans, and 11 make staff available during preparation of the plans to assist 12 State agencies with their plan-writing efforts. The Council shall complete its plan review process on or before June 1, 13 14 2008. The sustainability plans shall be reviewed and updated periodically, but at least once every 3 years. Units of local 15 16 government and educational institutions are encouraged to 17 submit similar sustainability plans to the chairman of the Council for review and approval. 18

19 (b) On or before January 1, 2008, each State agency, using existing resources, shall form an internal environmental 20 21 sustainability committee. The environmental sustainability 22 committee shall (i) assess the environmental and resource use 23 its major operational activities impacts of making environmental improvements, conserving resources, and reducing 24 25 health risks; (ii) develop annual environmental an 26 sustainability plan as required under this Act; and (iii)

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1 establish an ongoing process through which their 2 sustainability efforts can be reviewed and improved upon. The committee shall focus on the most significant environmental and 3 impacts, examine the feasibility 4 resource use and 5 cost-effectiveness of addressing these impacts, and prioritize 6 their actions accordingly.

7 Where feasible, the committee shall quantify the specific 8 impacts of major operational activities such as gallons of 9 water used, pounds of solid waste generated, gallons of 10 gasoline consumed, and dollars spent per year on electricity. 11 The committee shall consist of representatives from different 12 including departments and program areas, purchasing, 13 maintenance, and facility management. A senior member of management shall be designated to coordinate environmental 14 sustainability efforts of each committee. The coordinator 15 16 shall provide information to agency facilities and staff, 17 coordinate planning and reporting activities, and act as liaison to the Council. Where appropriate, State agencies may 18 19 appoint facility coordinators in addition to the agency 20 coordinator. Coordinators shall be given full management 21 support and provided with the necessary resources to meet the 22 goals of this Act.

(c) On or before July 1, 2008 and on or before September 1 of each subsequent year, each State agency shall submit to the chairman of the Council a report summarizing the progress made in implementing its <u>annual</u> environmental sustainability plan, HB3414 Enrolled - 9 - LRB097 08433 HLH 48560 b

including sustainability measures adopted and goals achieved.
 The information in this report shall encompass the previous
 fiscal year.

On or before June 1, 2008, the Council shall develop and adopt a reporting form to be used to comply with the provisions of this Section. Participating units of local government and educational institutions are encouraged to submit an annual progress report on or before September 1 of each year.

9 (d) State agencies shall be invited to participate in the 10 Council's efforts to foster environmental sustainability 11 practices throughout State government.

12 (e) The Council shall provide technical assistance to State 13 agencies, units of local government, and educational 14 institutions for the purpose of implementing the environmental 15 sustainability planning requirement.

16 (f) The Council may establish criteria for exempting select 17 State agencies from the environmental sustainability planning 18 based on staff size, probable environmental impacts, and scope 19 of operations.
