SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

625 ILCS 5/12-610.2

Amends the Illinois Vehicle Code. Provides that a person may not operate a motor vehicle on a roadway while using an electronic communication device (rather than only prohibiting the composing, sending, or reading of electronic messages while operating a vehicle) unless the electronic communication device is used in hands-free or voice-activated mode or one of 5 other limited exceptions apply.

1 AN ACT concerning transportation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by changing Section 12-610.2 as follows:
- 6 (625 ILCS 5/12-610.2)
- 7 Sec. 12-610.2. Electronic communication devices.
- As used in this Section, Section: "Electronic 8 9 communication device" means an electronic device, including but not limited to a wireless telephone, personal digital 10 assistant, or a portable or mobile computer while being used 11 for the purpose of composing, reading, or sending an electronic 12 message, but does not include a global positioning system or 13 14 navigation system or a device that is physically or electronically integrated into the motor vehicle. 15
 - "Electronic message" means a self contained piece of digital communication that is designed or intended to be transmitted between physical devices. "Electronic message" includes, but is not limited to electronic mail, a text message, an instant message, or a command or request to access an Internet site.
- 22 (b) A person may not operate a motor vehicle on a roadway 23 while using an electronic communication device to compose,

- 1 send, or read an electronic message.
- 2 (c) A violation of this Section is an offense against 3 traffic regulations governing the movement of vehicles.
 - (d) This Section does not apply to:
 - (1) a law enforcement officer or operator of an emergency vehicle while performing his or her official duties;
 - (2) a driver using an electronic communication device for the sole purpose of reporting an emergency situation and continued communication with emergency personnel during the emergency situation;
 - (3) a driver using an electronic communication device in hands-free or voice-activated mode;
 - (4) a driver of a commercial motor vehicle reading a message displayed on a permanently installed communication device designed for a commercial motor vehicle with a screen that does not exceed 10 inches tall by 10 inches wide in size;
 - (5) a driver using an electronic communication device while parked on the shoulder of a roadway; or
 - (6) a driver using an electronic communication device when the vehicle is stopped due to normal traffic being obstructed and the driver has the motor vehicle transmission in neutral or park.
