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1	AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 4402
2	AMENDMENT NO Amend House Bill 4402 by replacing
3	everything after the enacting clause with the following:
4	"Section 5. The Unified Code of Corrections is amended by
5	changing Section 3-7-2 as follows:
6	(730 ILCS 5/3-7-2) (from Ch. 38, par. 1003-7-2)
7	Sec. 3-7-2. Facilities.
8	(a) All institutions and facilities of the Department shall
9	provide every committed person with access to toilet
10	facilities, barber facilities, bathing facilities at least
11	once each week, a library of legal materials and published
12	materials including newspapers and magazines approved by the
13	Director. A committed person may not receive any materials that
14	the Director deems pornographic.
15	(b) (Blank).
16	(c) All institutions and facilities of the Department shall

provide facilities for every committed person to leave his cell for at least one hour each day unless the chief administrative officer determines that it would be harmful or dangerous to the security or safety of the institution or facility.

5 (d) All institutions and facilities of the Department shall provide every committed person with a wholesome and nutritional 6 diet at regularly scheduled hours, drinking water, clothing 7 adequate for the season, bedding, soap and towels and medical 8 9 and dental care. The Department shall provide committed persons 10 with powdered milk during meals if the cost of the powdered milk is less than liquid milk. The breakfast and lunch meals 11 provided to committed persons on Saturday and Sunday shall be 12 13 consolidated into a brunch meal for each of those days.

(e) All institutions and facilities of the Department shall permit every committed person to send and receive an unlimited number of uncensored letters, provided, however, that the Director may order that mail be inspected and read for reasons of the security, safety or morale of the institution or facility.

20 (f) All of the institutions and facilities of the Department shall permit every committed person to receive 21 22 visitors, except in case of abuse of the visiting privilege or when the chief administrative officer determines that such 23 24 visiting would be harmful or dangerous to the security, safety 25 morale of the institution or facility. The chief or 26 administrative officer shall have the right to restrict

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1 visitation to non-contact visits for reasons of safety, security, and order, including, but not limited to, restricting 2 3 contact visits for committed persons engaged in gang activity. 4 No committed person in a super maximum security facility or on 5 disciplinary segregation is allowed contact visits. Any 6 committed person found in possession of illegal drugs or who fails a drug test shall not be permitted contact visits for a 7 8 period of at least 6 months. Any committed person involved in 9 gang activities or found quilty of assault committed against a 10 Department employee shall not be permitted contact visits for a 11 period of at least 6 months. The Department shall offer every visitor appropriate written information concerning HIV and 12 13 AIDS, including information concerning how to contact the 14 Illinois Department of Public Health for counseling 15 The Department shall develop the information. written 16 materials in consultation with the Department of Public Health. The Department shall ensure that all such information and 17 18 materials are culturally sensitive and reflect cultural 19 diversity as appropriate. Implementation of the changes made to 20 this Section by this amendatory Act of the 94th General 21 Assembly is subject to appropriation.

(f-5) The Department shall establish a pilot program in one or more institutions or facilities of the Department to permit committed persons to remotely visit family members through interactive video conferences. The Department may enter into agreements with third-party organizations to provide video 09700HB4402ham001 -4- LRB097 15394 RLC 66111 a

1 conference facilities for family members of committed persons. 2 The Department may determine who is a family member eligible to participate in the program and the conditions in which and 3 4 times when the video conferences may be conducted. The 5 Department may conduct such conferences as an alternative to 6 transporting committed persons to facilities and institutions of the Department near the residences of family members of the 7 8 committed persons.

9 Beginning on October 1, 2010 and through October 1, 2012, 10 the Department shall issue an annual report to the General 11 Assembly regarding the implementation and effectiveness of the 12 pilot program created by this subsection (f-5).

13 (g) All institutions and facilities of the Department shall 14 permit religious ministrations and sacraments to be available 15 to every committed person, but attendance at religious services 16 shall not be required.

(h) Within 90 days after December 31, 1996, the Department shall prohibit the use of curtains, cell-coverings, or any other matter or object that obstructs or otherwise impairs the line of vision into a committed person's cell.
