1	AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 5435
2	AMENDMENT NO Amend House Bill 5435, AS AMENDED, by
3	replacing everything after the enacting clause with the
4	following:
5	"Section 5. The Civil Administrative Code of Illinois is
6	amended by adding Section 5-715 as follows:
7	(20 ILCS 5/5-715 new)
8	Sec. 5-715. Expedited temporary licensure for service
9	members and spouses.
10	(a) In this Section, "service member" means any person who,
11	at the time of application under this Section, is an active
12	duty member of the United States Armed Forces or any reserve
13	component of the United States Armed Forces or the National
14	Guard of any state, commonwealth, or territory of the United
15	States or the District of Columbia or whose active duty service
16	concluded within the preceding 2 years before application.

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1 In this Section, "spouse" includes any party to a civil 2 union under the Illinois Religious Freedom Protection and Civil 3 Union Act. 4 (b) Each director of a department that issues an 5 occupational or professional license is authorized to and shall issue an expedited temporary occupational or professional 6 license, other than a license for a physician under the Medical 7 Practice Act of 1987 or a license for a dentist under the 8 9 Illinois Dental Practice Act, to a service member who meets the 10 requirements under this Section. The temporary occupational or professional license shall be valid for one year after the date 11 12 of issuance or until a license is granted or a notice to deny a 13 license is issued in accordance with rules adopted by the department issuing the license, whichever occurs first. No 14 15 temporary occupational or professional license shall be 16 renewed. The service member shall apply to the department on forms provided by the department. An application must include 17 18 proof that: 19 (1) the applicant is a service member; 20 (2) the applicant holds a valid license in good 21 standing for the occupation or profession issued by another state, commonwealth, possession, or territory of the 22 United States, the District of Columbia, or any foreign 23 24 jurisdiction and the requirements for licensure in the 25 other jurisdiction are determined by the department to be 26 substantially equivalent to the standards for licensure of

2	(3) the applicant is assigned to a duty station in this
3	State or has established legal residence in this State;
4	(4) a complete set of the applicant's fingerprints has
5	been submitted to the Department of State Police for
6	statewide and national criminal history checks, if
7	applicable to the requirements of the department issuing
8	the license; the applicant shall pay the fee to the
9	Department of State Police or to the fingerprint vendor for
10	electronic fingerprint processing; no temporary
11	occupational or professional license shall be issued to an
12	applicant if the statewide or national criminal history
13	check discloses information that would cause the denial of
14	an application for licensure under any applicable
15	occupational or professional licensing Act;
16	(5) the applicant is not ineligible for licensure
17	pursuant to Section 2105-165 of the Civil Administrative
18	<u>Code of Illinois;</u>
19	(6) the applicant has submitted an application for full
20	licensure; and
21	(7) the applicant has paid the required fee; fees shall
22	not be refundable.
23	(c) Each director of a department that issues an
24	occupational or professional license is authorized to and shall
25	issue an expedited temporary occupational or professional
26	license, other than a license for a physician under the Medical

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1	Practice Act of 1987 or a license for a dentist under the
2	Illinois Dental Practice Act, to the spouse of a service member
3	who meets the requirements under this Section. The temporary
4	occupational or professional license shall be valid for one
5	year after the date of issuance or until a license is granted
6	or a notice to deny a license is issued in accordance with
7	rules adopted by the department issuing the license, whichever
8	occurs first. No temporary occupational or professional
9	license shall be renewed. The spouse of a service member shall
10	apply to the department on forms provided by the department. An
11	application must include proof that:
12	(1) the applicant is the spouse of a service member;
13	(2) the applicant holds a valid license in good
14	standing for the occupation or profession issued by another
15	state, commonwealth, possession, or territory of the
16	United States, the District of Columbia, or any foreign
17	jurisdiction and the requirements for licensure in the
18	other jurisdiction are determined by the department to be
19	substantially equivalent to the standards for licensure of
20	this State;
21	(3) the applicant's spouse is assigned to a duty
22	station in this State or has established legal residence in
23	this State;
24	(4) a complete set of the applicant's fingerprints has
25	been submitted to the Department of State Police for
26	statewide and national criminal history checks, if

1	applicable to the requirements of the department issuing
2	the license; the applicant shall pay the fee to the
3	Department of State Police or to the fingerprint vendor for
4	electronic fingerprint processing; no temporary
5	occupational or professional license shall be issued to an
6	applicant if the statewide or national criminal history
7	check discloses information that would cause the denial of
8	an application for licensure under any applicable
9	occupational or professional licensing Act;
10	(5) the applicant is not ineligible for licensure
11	pursuant to Section 2105-165 of the Civil Administrative
12	Code of Illinois;
13	(6) the applicant has submitted an application for full
14	licensure; and
15	(7) the applicant has paid the required fee; fees shall
16	not be refundable.
17	(d) All relevant experience of a service member in the
18	discharge of official duties, including full-time and
19	part-time experience, shall be credited in the calculation of
20	any years of practice in an occupation or profession as may be
21	required under any applicable occupational or professional
22	licensing Act. All relevant training provided by the military
23	and completed by a service member shall be credited to that
24	service member as meeting any training or education requirement
25	under any applicable occupational or professional licensing

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1	the department to be substantially equivalent to that required
2	under any applicable Act and is not otherwise contrary to any
3	other licensure requirement.
4	(e) A department may adopt any rules necessary for the
5	implementation and administration of this Section and shall by
6	rule provide for fees for the administration of this Section.
7	In addition, a department shall develop forms to facilitate the
8	expedited temporary license application process, as well as
9	contact information for service members to use in making
10	application for an expedited temporary license.
11	(f) The Department of Veterans' Affairs shall make copies
12	of the forms and contact information described in subsection
13	(e) of this Section available to service members in this
14	State.".
