

## 97TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2011 and 2012 SB0113

Introduced 1/27/2011, by Sen. Martin A. Sandoval

## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

New Act 20 ILCS 605/605-45

Creates the Small Business Contracts Act. Provides that not less than 10% of the total dollar amount of State contracts shall be established as a goal to be awarded to small businesses. Provides for compliance plans and annual reports to help monitor the implementation of the 10% goal. Amends the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois. Provides that not less than 25% of the total dollar amount available to the Department for awarding grants shall be awarded to small businesses. Effective immediately.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- 4 Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the Small
- 5 Business Contracts Act.
- 6 Section 5. Definitions. For the purposes of this Act, the
- 7 following terms shall have the following definitions:
- 8 "Department" means the Department of Commerce and Economic
- 9 Opportunity.
- "Small business" means an independently owned and operated
- business that has fewer than 50 full-time employees.
- "State contract" means a State contract, funded
- 13 exclusively with State funds which are not subject to federal
- 14 reimbursement, whether competitively bid or negotiated, as
- defined by the Department.
- "State official or agency" means a department, officer,
- board, commission, institution, or body politic or corporate of
- 18 the State.
- 19 Section 10. Award of State contracts.
- 20 (a) Not less than 10% of the total dollar amount of State
- 21 contracts, as defined by the Department, shall be established
- as a goal to be awarded to small businesses.

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1 (b) The percentage in subsection (a) relates to the total 2 dollar amount of State contracts during each State fiscal year, 3 calculated by examining independently each type of contract for 4 each State official or agency which lets such contracts.

Section 15. Compliance plans.

- (a) Each State official or agency shall file with the Department an annual compliance plan which shall outline the goals of the State official or agency for contracting with small businesses for the then current fiscal year, the manner in which the official or agency intends to reach these goals, and a timetable for reaching these goals. The Department shall review and approve the plan of each State official or agency and may reject any plan that does not comply with this Act or any rules promulgated pursuant to this Act.
- (b) Each State official or agency shall file with the Department an annual report of its utilization of small businesses during the preceding fiscal year including lapse period spending and a mid-fiscal year report of its utilization to date for the then current fiscal year. The reports shall include a self-evaluation of the efforts of the State official or agency to meet its goals under the Act.
- Section 20. Annual report. The Department shall file no later than March 1 of each year, an annual report that shall detail the level of achievement toward the goals specified in

- this Act over the 3 most recent fiscal years. The annual report
- 2 shall include, but need not be limited to, the following:
- 3 (1) a summary detailing State appropriations subject 4 to the goals, the actual goals specified, and the goals 5 attained by each State official or agency;
- 6 (2) a summary of the number of contracts awarded and
  7 the average contract amount by each State official or
  8 agency; and
- 9 (3) an analysis of the level of overall goal achievement concerning purchases from small businesses.
- Section 905. The Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois is amended by changing Section 605-45 as follows:
- 14 (20 ILCS 605/605-45)
- 15 Sec. 605-45. Economic development grants; policy considerations.
- 17 <u>(a)</u> When awarding grants for any economic development purpose, the Department must consider (i) reserving and targeting State business incentives to areas with high unemployment or low income and (ii) if the applicant seeking the grant is located in a metropolitan area, whether that metropolitan area meets location efficiency standards.
- 23 <u>(b) In a fiscal year, not less than 25% of the total dollar</u>
  24 <u>amount available to the Department for awarding grants under</u>

- 1 this Article shall be awarded to small businesses that are
- 2 <u>independently owned and operated and have fewer than 50</u>
- full-time employees.
