1 AN ACT concerning State government.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The State Comptroller Act is amended by adding Section 23.9 as follows:

6 (15 ILCS 405/23.9 new)

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Sec. 23.9. Minority Contractor Opportunity Initiative. The State Comptroller Minority Contractor Opportunity Initiative is created to provide greater opportunities for minority-owned businesses, female-owned businesses, businesses owned by persons with disabilities, and small businesses with 20 or fewer employees in this State to participate in the State procurement process. The initiative shall be administered by the Comptroller. Under this initiative, the Comptroller is responsible for the following: (i) outreach to minority-owned businesses, female-owned businesses, businesses owned by persons with disabilities, and small businesses capable of providing services to the State; (ii) education of minority-owned businesses, female-owned businesses, businesses owned by persons with disabilities, and small businesses concerning State contracting and procurement; (iii) notification of minority-owned businesses, female-owned businesses, businesses owned by persons with disabilities, and

small businesses of State contracting opportunities; and (iv) 1 maintenance of an online database of State contracts that 2 3 identifies the contracts awarded to minority-owned businesses, 4 female-owned businesses, businesses owned by persons with 5 disabilities, and small businesses that includes the total amount paid by State agencies to contractors and the percentage 6 paid to minority-owned businesses, female-owned businesses, 7 businesses owned by persons with disabilities, and small 8 9 businesses. 10 The Comptroller shall work with the Business Enterprise 11 Council created under Section 5 of the Business Enterprise for 12 Minorities, Females, and Persons with Disabilities Act to fulfill the Comptroller's responsibilities under this Section. 13 14 The Comptroller may rely on the Business Enterprise Council's identification of minority-owned businesses, female-owned 15 16 businesses, and businesses owned by persons with disabilities. 17 The Comptroller shall annually prepare and submit a report to the Governor and the General Assembly concerning the 18 progress of this initiative including the following 19 20 information for the preceding calendar year: (i) a statement of 21 the total amounts paid by each executive branch agency to 22 contractors since the previous report; (ii) the percentage of 23 the amounts that were paid to minority-owned businesses, 24 female-owned businesses, businesses owned by persons with 25 disabilities, and small businesses; (iii) the successes achieved and the challenges faced by the Comptroller in 26

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operating outreach programs for minorities, women, persons 1 2 with disabilities, and small businesses; (iv) the challenges each executive branch agency may face in hiring qualified 3 4 minority, female, disabled, and small business employees and contracting with qualified minority-owned businesses, 5 female-owned businesses, businesses owned by persons with 6 7 disabilities, and small businesses; and (iv) any other information, findings, conclusions, and recommendations for 8 9 legislative or agency action, as the Comptroller deems 10 appropriate. 11 On and after the effective date of this amendatory Act of 12 the 97th General Assembly, any bidder or offeror awarded a 13 contract of \$1,000 or more under Section 20-10, 20-15, 20-25, 14 or 20-30 of the Illinois Procurement Code is required to pay a 15 fee of \$15 to cover expenses related to the administration of
