## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

30 ILCS 583/5

Amends the State Prohibition of Goods from Forced Labor Act. Makes a technical change in a Section concerning policy.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- 4 Section 5. The State Prohibition of Goods from Forced Labor
- 5 Act is amended by changing Section 5 as follows:

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- Sec. 5. Policy. <u>The</u> The General Assembly hereby finds and declares as follows:
- 9 (a) The people of Illinois do not support the import of any goods made by forced, convict, or indentured labor, not only because it is a cruel suppression of the human right of free labor and employment practices, but also because it creates an unfair trade advantage for the forced, convict, or indentured
- 15 (b) The federal Tariff Act of 1930, while prohibiting the
- 16 importation of any goods produced in whole or in part by
- forced, convict, or indentured labor, does not require
- 18 importers to provide certificates of origin at the time of
- 19 importation to affirm and guarantee no forced, convict, or
- indentured labor content.
- 21 (c) The federal Tariff Act of 1930 also does not require
- 22 the United States Customs Service to have an active,
- 23 self-initiated foreign surveillance program of detecting

- forced, convict, or indentured labor-made goods and preventing
- 2 their entry into the United States, but relies primarily upon
- 3 complaints made by the public or other interested groups.
- 4 (d) The State of Illinois wholeheartedly supports the
- 5 prohibition on imports produced in whole or in part by forced,
- 6 convict, or indentured labor and shall not knowingly acquire
- 7 any of those goods.
