1 AN ACT concerning gaming.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Video Gaming Act is amended by changing
Section 55 as follows:

6 (230 ILCS 40/55)

7 Sec. 55. Precondition for licensed location. In all cases 8 of application for a licensed location, to operate a video 9 gaming terminal, each licensed establishment, licensed fraternal establishment, or licensed veterans establishment 10 shall possess a valid liquor license issued by the Illinois 11 Liquor Control Commission in effect at the time of application 12 and at all times thereafter during which a video gaming 13 14 terminal is made available to the public for play at that location. Video gaming terminals in a licensed location shall 15 16 be operated only during the same hours of operation generally 17 permitted to holders of a license under the Liquor Control Act of 1934 within the unit of local government in which they are 18 19 located. A licensed truck stop establishment that does not hold 20 a liquor license may operate video gaming terminals on a 21 continuous basis. A licensed fraternal establishment or 22 licensed veterans establishment that does not hold a liquor license may operate video gaming terminals if (i) 23 the

establishment is located in a county with a population between 1 2 6,500 and 7,000, based on the 2000 U.S. Census, (ii) the county 3 prohibits by ordinance the sale of alcohol, and (iii) the 4 establishment is in a portion of the county where the sale of 5 alcohol is prohibited. A licensed fraternal establishment or 6 licensed veterans establishment that does not hold a liquor 7 license may operate video gaming terminals if (i) the 8 establishment is located in a municipality within a county with 9 a population between 8,500 and 9,000 based on the 2000 U.S. 10 Census and (ii) the municipality or county prohibits or limits 11 the sale of alcohol by ordinance in a way that prohibits the 12 establishment from selling alcohol.
