Failure to renew by the expiration date within 60 days of the date shall cause the license to lapse. A lapsed license may not be reinstated until a written application is filed, the renewal fee is paid, and a \$50 reinstatement fee is paid. The renewal and reinstatement fees shall be waived for persons who did not renew while on active duty in the military and who file for renewal or restoration within one year after discharge from the active duty service.
