1 Committee shall publicly convene no less than 2 4 times per year. The Committee's responsibilities shall include, but not 2 be limited to, providing guidance to the lead agency regarding 3 4 programmatic and fiscal management and accountability, 5 provider development and accountability, contracting, systems' 6 coordination, and program outcome measures. During the life of 7 the Committee, on a quarterly basis, or more often as the Committee may request, the lead agency shall provide to the 8 9 Committee, and simultaneously to the public, through postings 10 on the lead agency's early intervention website, quarterly 11 reports containing monthly data and other early intervention program information that the Committee requests. The first data 12 13 report must be supplied no later than October 31, 2012 September 21, 2001, and must include the previous 2 quarters of 14 15 data. The Ounce of Prevention Fund shall provide staff and 16 administrative support services to the Committee.
