1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 Section 5. "AN ACT making appropriations", Public Act
6 97-0060, approved June 30, 2011, as vetoed, reduced and
7 restored is amended by changing Section 10 as follows:

8 (P.A. 97-0060, Sec. 10)

9 Sec. 10. The following amounts or so much thereof as may
10 be necessary, which shall be used by the Illinois State Board
11 of Education exclusively for the foregoing purposes and not,
12 under any circumstances, for personal services expenditures
13 or other operational or administrative costs, are
14 appropriated to the Illinois State Board of Education for the
15 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2011:
