9 WHEREAS, He was a United States Navy Veteran serving in 10 World War II in the Pacific; he enjoyed the Veteran's Day 11 celebrations hosted by the Carlinville School District where he 12 was a guest speaker for his great-grandchildren's classes, 13 telling them to all join the Navy so they would have a nice 14 comfortable bed instead of sleeping on the cold, hard ground 15 like you have to do in the Army; and

16 WHEREAS, He worked for over 30 years for G. H.
