SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

110 ILCS 305/7e-5
110 ILCS 520/8d-5
110 ILCS 660/5-88

Amends various Acts relating to the governance of public universities in Illinois. With respect to in-state tuition charges, provides that a person who is honorably discharged from the armed forces of the United States shall be granted immediate classification as an in-state student on honorable discharge from the armed forces and, while in continuous attendance toward the degree for which he or she is currently enrolled, does not lose in-state student classification if the person has registered to vote in this State and has demonstrated objective evidence of an intent to be a resident of this State, which includes at least (i) an Illinois driver's license, (ii) Illinois motor vehicle registration, (iii) employment history in this State, (iv) transfer of major banking services to this State, (v) a change of permanent address on all pertinent records, or (vi) other materials of whatever kind or source relevant to domicile or residency status. 2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,**
3 **represented in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The University of Illinois Act is amended by
5 changing Section 7e-5 as follows:

6 (110 ILCS 305/7e-5)

7 Sec. 7e-5. In-state tuition charge.

8 (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the
9 contrary, for tuition purposes, the Board of Trustees shall
10 deem an individual an Illinois resident, until the individual
11 establishes a residence outside of this State, if all of the
12 following conditions are met:

13 (1) The individual resided with his or her parent or
14 guardian while attending a public or private high school in
15 this State.

16 (2) The individual graduated from a public or private
17 high school or received the equivalent of a high school
18 diploma in this State.

19 (3) The individual attended school in this State for at
20 least 3 years as of the date the individual graduated from
21 high school or received the equivalent of a high school
22 diploma.

23 (4) The individual registers as an entering student in

1 the University not earlier than the 2003 fall semester.

8 high school or received the equivalent of a high school
9 diploma in this State.

10 (3) The individual attended school in this State for at
11 least 3 years as of the date the individual graduated from
12 high school or received the equivalent of a high school
13 diploma.

14 (4) The individual registers as an entering student in
15 the University not earlier than the 2003 fall semester.

16 (5) In the case of an individual who is not a citizen
17 or a permanent resident of the United States, the
18 individual provides the University with an affidavit
19 stating that the individual will file an application to
20 become a permanent resident of the United States at the
21 earliest opportunity the individual is eligible to do so.

22 This subsection (a) applies only to tuition for a term or
23 semester that begins on or after May 20, 2003 (the effective
24 date of Public Act 93-7). Any revenue lost by the University in
25 implementing this subsection (a) shall be absorbed by the
26 University Income Fund.

1 (b) If a person is on active military duty and stationed in
2 Illinois, then the Board shall deem that person and any of his
3 or her dependents Illinois residents for tuition purposes.
4 Beginning with the 2009-2010 academic year, if a person is on
5 active military duty and is stationed out of State, but he or
6 she was stationed in this State for at least 3 years
7 immediately prior to being reassigned out of State, then the
8 Board shall deem that person and any of his or her dependents
9 Illinois residents for tuition purposes, as long as that person
10 or his or her dependent (i) applies for admission to the
11 University within 18 months of the person on active military
12 duty being reassigned or (ii) remains continuously enrolled at
13 the University.

14 (c) With respect to in-state tuition charges, a person who
15 is honorably discharged from the armed forces of the United
16 States shall be granted immediate classification as an in-state
17 student on honorable discharge from the armed forces and, while
18 in continuous attendance toward the degree for which he or she
19 is currently enrolled, does not lose in-state student
20 classification if the person has met the following
21 requirements:

22 (1) Has registered to vote in this State.

23 (2) Has demonstrated objective evidence of an intent to
24 be a resident of this State, which, for the purposes of
25 this subsection (c), includes at least one of the
26 following:

- 1 (A) An Illinois driver's license.
- 2 (B) Illinois motor vehicle registration.
- 3 (C) Employment history in this State.
- 4 (D) Transfer of major banking services to this
5 State.
- 6 (E) A change of permanent address on all pertinent
7 records.
- 8 (F) Other materials of whatever kind or source
9 relevant to domicile or residency status.
