1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 1156 2 AMENDMENT NO. . Amend House Bill 1156, AS AMENDED, by 3 inserting the following in its proper numeric sequence: "Section 35. Possession prohibition exemption; 4 5 registration. (a) This Act does not apply to a person who possessed a 6 7 prohibited assault weapon or assault weapon attachment before the effective date of this Act of the 98th General Assembly, 8 provided the person has provided in a registration affidavit, 9 under oath or affirmation and in the form and manner prescribed 10 11 by the Department of State Police on or after 180 days after 12 the effective date of this Act of the 98th General Assembly but 13 within 300 days after the effective date of this Act: 14 (1) his or her name; (2) his or her date of birth; 15 16 (3) his or her Firearm Owner's Identification Card 17 number;

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- 1 (4) the make, model, caliber, and serial number of the weapon or attachment; and
- 3 (5) proof of a locking mechanism that properly fits the weapon.
 - (b) The affidavit shall include a statement that the weapon or assault weapon attachment is owned by the person submitting the affidavit and that he or she owns a proper locking mechanism for the weapon.
 - (c) The affidavit form shall include the following statement printed in bold type: "Warning: Entering false information on this form is punishable as perjury under Section 32-2 of the Criminal Code of 2012."
 - (d) Beginning 300 days after the effective date of this Act of the 98th General Assembly, the person may transfer a registered assault weapon or assault weapon attachment to an heir, an individual residing in another state maintaining it in another state, or a dealer licensed as a federal firearms dealer under Section 923 of the federal Gun Control Act of 1968. Within 10 days after transfer of the weapon or attachment except to an heir, the person shall notify the Department of State Police of the name and address of the transferee and comply with the requirements of the Firearm Identification Card Act. The person to whom the weapon is transferred may transfer it only as provided in this subsection.
 - (e) The Department of State Police shall implement this
