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AN ACT concerning State government.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 2 represented in the General Assembly: 3

Section 5. The Department of Central Management Services 4 5 Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois is amended by changing Section 405-335 as follows: 6

7 (20 ILCS 405/405-335)

Sec. 405-335. Illinois Transparency and Accountability 8 9 Portal (ITAP).

(a) The Department, within 12 months after January 1, 2010 10 the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 96th General 11 Assembly, shall establish and maintain a website, known as the 12 13 Illinois Transparency and Accountability Portal (ITAP), with a 14 full-time webmaster tasked with compiling and updating the ITAP database with information received from all State agencies as 15 16 defined in this Section. Subject to appropriation, the 17 full-time webmaster must also compile and update the ITAP with information received from all counties, 18 database 19 townships, and municipalities.

20 (a-5) As soon as practical after this amendatory Act of the 21 98th General Assembly, the Department must compile and update 22 the ITAP database with information received under subsection (c-5) of this Section. 23

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(b) For purposes of this Section:

2 "State agency" means the offices of the constitutional 3 officers identified in Article V of the Illinois Constitution, 4 executive agencies, and departments, boards, commissions, and 5 Authorities under the Governor.

6 "Contracts" means payment obligations with vendors on file 7 with the Office of the Comptroller to purchase goods and 8 services exceeding \$10,000 in value (or, in the case of 9 professional or artistic services, exceeding \$5,000 in value).

10 "Appropriation" means line-item detail of spending 11 approved by the General Assembly and Governor, categorized by 12 object of expenditure.

13 "Individual consultants" means temporary workers eligible14 to receive State benefits paid on a State payroll.

15 "Recipients" means State agencies receiving 16 appropriations.

17 <u>"Unit of local government" or "local government" includes,</u>
18 <u>without limitation, counties, townships, municipalities,</u>
19 <u>community college districts, school districts, special purpose</u>
20 <u>districts, and any other unit of government with the power to</u>
21 <u>levy taxes. "Unit of local government" or "local government"</u>
22 <u>does not include a State agency as defined in this subsection.</u>

23 (c) The ITAP shall provide direct access to each of the 24 following:

(1) A database of all current State employees and
 individual consultants, except sworn law enforcement

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officers, sorted separately by: 1 2 (i) Name. 3 (ii) Employing State agency. (iii) Employing State division. 4 5 (iv) Employment position title. 6 (v) Current pay rate and year-to-date pay. (2) A database of all current State expenditures, 7 8 sorted separately by agency, category, recipient, and 9 Representative District. 10 (3)А database of all development assistance 11 reportable pursuant to the Corporate Accountability for 12 Tax Expenditures Act, sorted separately by tax credit

14 (4) A database of all revocations and suspensions of 15 State occupation and use tax certificates of registration 16 and all revocations and suspensions of State professional 17 licenses, sorted separately by name, geographic location, and certificate of registration number or license number, 18 19 applicable. Professional license revocations as and 20 suspensions shall be posted only if resulting from a failure to pay taxes, license fees, or child support. 21

A searchable database of all county, 23 township, and municipal employees hired on or after effective date of this amendatory Act of the 97th General 24 25 Assembly, sorted separately by each of the following at the 26 time of employment:

11	(iii) Employment position title.
12	(iv) Current pay rate and year-to-date pay.
13	(2) All financial reports and audits required to be
14	filed by the unit of local government with a State agency
15	or another unit of local government, including, but not
16	limited to, reports and audits required to be filed with
17	the Comptroller under Section 8-8-3 of the Illinois
18	Municipal Code.
19	(3) All Tax Increment Financing Reports required to be
20	filed with the Comptroller under Section 8-8-3.5 of the
21	Illinois Municipal Code.
22	(4) The account of the municipal treasurer required
23	under Section 3.1-35-65 of the Illinois Municipal Code.
24	(5) The report of the police and firefighter pension
25	board that is required to be issued to a municipality under
26	Section 3-143 or 4-134 of the Illinois Pension Code.

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1(6) The report filed by the Illinois Municipal2Retirement Fund under Section 7-192 of the Illinois Pension3Code and each Governmental Accounting Standards Board4Pension Disclosure that the Fund provides to a unit of5local government.

6 (d) The ITAP shall include all information required to be 7 published by <u>subsections</u> subsection (c) <u>and (c-5)</u> of this 8 Section that is available to the Department in a format the 9 Department can compile and publish on the ITAP. The Department 10 shall update the ITAP as additional information becomes 11 available in a format that can be compiled and published on the 12 ITAP by the Department.

13 (e) Each State agency, county, township, and municipality, 14 or other unit of local government shall cooperate with the 15 Department in furnishing the information necessary for the 16 implementation of this Section within a timeframe specified by 17 the Department. The Department, however, may not require that any report, accounting, or other filing that is filed pursuant 18 to a statute or other law be submitted at a different time or 19 20 in a different manner or format than was used by the State agency or local government in creating the document. 21

(f) Each county, township, or municipality, or other unit of local government submitting information to be displayed on the Illinois Transparency and Accountability Portal (ITAP) is responsible for the accuracy of the information provided.
