### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

55 ILCS 5/5-1114

from Ch. 34, par. 5-1114

Amends the Counties Code. Provides that in actions for the violation of any county ordinance, the first process shall be a summons, "a notice to appear", or a warrant. Provides that in the case of a violation of a county's building code or property maintenance code, the county's code enforcement officer may issue a notice to appear.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Counties Code is amended by changing Section
5-1114 as follows:

6 (55 ILCS 5/5-1114) (from Ch. 34, par. 5-1114)

7 Sec. 5-1114. Violation of ordinance.

(a) Except as provided in Section 10-302.5 of the Illinois 8 9 Highway Code or subsection (b) of this Section, in all actions 10 for the violation of any county ordinance, the first process shall be a summons, a notice to appear, or a warrant. A warrant 11 12 or summons for the arrest of an accused person may issue from 13 the circuit court upon the affidavit of any person that an 14 ordinance has been violated, and that the person making the complaint has reasonable grounds to believe that the party 15 16 charged is guilty thereof. Every person arrested upon a warrant 17 or summons shall be taken, without unnecessary delay, before the proper judicial officer for trial. 18

(b) In the case of a violation of the property maintenance code of the county by a repeat offender, service of process against the owner of the property that is the subject of the violation may be a notice to appear. The notice may be issued by a code enforcement officer of the county where the violation

occurred subject to the approval of an ordinance administrator. 1 2 The notice to appear shall, at a minimum, state the address of 3 the property that is the subject of the code violation, the language and citation of the code provision that was violated, 4 5 the facts that the violation is based on, the date, time, and location for the appearance by the property owner, and that 6 7 failure to correct the violation prior to the hearing date may 8 result in a fine. The notice to appear shall be served upon the 9 property owner, either personally, or by delivery confirmation mail and first class mail. The violation notice shall be sent 10 11 to the address where the violation is observed and to the 12 property owner's address on file with the Supervisor of 13 Assessments office. The county shall simultaneously post the 14 notice on the property where the violation occurred. The date 15 to appear shall be no sooner than 15 days after the notice is 16 served upon the owner. If the owner of the property fails to 17 appear in response to the notice, the Court may issue a warrant or summons in accordance with subsection (a) of this Section. 18 For the purposes of this Section, "repeat offender" means a 19 20 person who has been found quilty of 2 or more similar 21 violations of a property maintenance code at the same location in a 36-month period. In the case of a violation of a county 22 23 building code or property maintenance code, the county code enforcement officer provided for by the county in its 24 25 respective building or property maintenance code may issue a 26 notice to appear.
