ARTICLE 1.1

3 Section 1. The amount of \$100,000, or so much thereof as 4 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Sex Offender Management Board Fund to the Sex Offender Management Board 5 6 for the purposes authorized by the Sex Offender Management Board Act including, but not limited to, sex offender 7 8 evaluation, treatment, and monitoring programs and grants. 9 Funding received from private sources is to be expended in 10 accordance with the terms and conditions placed upon the funding. 11

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1, 2013.
